THE "BAPTIST BIBLE"

In the characteristic 'nepspaper way" a number of papers have put out as a bit of sensational news the fact that the Baptists have thrown Jonah's whale overboard from the Bible and substituted "a great fish." Also, some of them stated, they had modified the Lord's Prayer. For instance: the modified form of the Lord's Prayer that they ascribe to the Baptists is the form published first in 1881 in the Revised Version of the New Testament, which is being used every Sunday by hundreds of churches throughout the land. The Baptists, nor anyone else, could eliminate the whale from the Book of Jonah for the simple reason that neither the King James Version, the Donay Version or the revised version contains even a reference to a whale. The "great fish" of Jonah has become popularly called a "whale" because the common English versions use the word "whale" in that passage in Matthew which contains a reference to the Jonah story. Even there "sea monster" is in the margin of the Revised Version. This "Baptist Bible" is really the Improved Edition of the Bible based largely upon the Bible Union Version and published by the American Baptist Publication Society. It contains a good many variations from all the other versions but nothing to warrant the "scare" headlines some of the papers have given it. It is the final result of thirty years of labor and thought and is a great work. It is true that this edition puts "immerse" in parenthesis after "baptize" but this is not new as the Bible Union version was nublished in two forms, one using "baptize" and the other "immerse." This edition merely puts them together as alternatives.






