In a recont issue of the Times-Dispetch appears an interesting interview with Hon R. Tate Irvine, of Big Stone Gap, Va., an ar dent Wilson supporter and one of the Wilson floor leaders in the Norfolk Convention, and a delegate at large to the Baltimore Convention, in which he expressed the most optimistic view of the business prospects of the country under the incoming administration. He predicts greater progress and development in the coal, coke and iron industries of Southwest Virginia during the next four years than in any four years in our history.

Speaking of Virginia's prospects for a place in the Cabinet, h says: "I believe Virginia has strong claims upon Mr. Wilson in this particular which he would be glad to recognize. The friends of Hon.
