TAX LAWS

Since the publication in these columns a few weeks ago of an editorial concerning present and future tax laws we have received so many comments upon the subject and so many requests for er than ever. -Star. more on the same subject that we have spent some time arranging our ideas and will try to give briefly what we believe would be the proper line of work for the compilation of a new adjustment of these very important laws.

In the first place it must be borne in mind that Virginia is an agricultural state. The property of the state is based upon the do it. conditions of its agricultural interests. The farm is the producer not only of that which we eat, but that which provides the basis of the pocketbook. of a large proportion of our business enterprises and should be especially considered in any plan for a just-system of taxation. We believe that taxable property should be divided into classes and each class assessed at a certain per cent of its true and full value. something as follows:

Class 1. All public service corporations such as railroads, telegross earnings.

Class 2. All ore, mined or unmined, should be assessed at 50 per cent and listed seperately from the real estate in which it is

Class 3. All timber and pasture lands, and all unplatted real makes one wonder how he has any fun. estate used for agricultural purposes or unused should be assessed at 331 per cent of its true value.

Class 4. All real estate and the dwelling house and appurtenant structures thereon actually used and occupied as the home-

assessed at 25 per cent of its full and true value. Class 5. All other real estate should be in a class by itself and hardest to bear are those which never come.—Lowell. assessed at 50 per cent of its full and true value.

Class 6.
