

In a ton of high grade goods analyzing 10-5-5 we find 200 pounds of phosphate, 100 pounds of nitrogen and 100 pounds of potash. A like application of this fertilizer will give much more value than of the low grade with only a slight increase in price. To make a ton of this high grade goods we would need 1,250 pounds of acid phosphate, 600 pounds of nitrate of soda and 200 pounds of muriate of potash and no filler. It is evident that in buying high grade fertilizer you are not paying for any filler.

remain. Fertilize the trees with stable manure and mineral fertilizers for the first year, afterward planting cowpeas about the roots to gather nitrogen.

Spraying is a necessity if we would raise fruit. Spray once before the leaves appear with lime-sulphur solution one part to 9 of water to kill scale and control leaf spot. Spray a second time when the petals fall with lime-sulphur, one part to 40 of water, and 2 pounds of arsenate of lead to a barrel of water to control apple scab and leaf spot and kill the codling moth. Spray a third time with Bordeaux mixture when the fruit is well set to control the bitter rot.

Prof. Chas. G. Maphis spoke on the requirements of a first class High School such as this: "It must have at least three teachers who are college or normal graduates. It must run for 9 months or 180 days and the subjects to which credit is given must be taught for 40 minute periods, five times a week. Besides this it must take only such students as are well prepared by an equally good grammar school. Manassas schools now receive \$4,150 a year from the State, which is more than any other High School in the State receives. This is received on the condition that the school shall teach agriculture, domestic science and normal training in a satisfactory manner. This appropriation covers the cost of the High School so that it does not cost the community a cent. Unless the district and county do their share by supporting the grammar school and giving suitable room for the High School the State will withdraw its support."

Mr. Maphis urged that the Manassas district raise the tax to the amount of 25 cents on a hundred dollars in order to maintain the schools at their present efficiency.

Supervisor Gulick then said that if it was the wish of a majority of the property owners or of those who pay a majority of the tax, he would restore the 25 cent tax. On motion the chair appointed Messrs. Steere, J. J. Conner and J. P. Leachman to circulate a petition asking for an increase of the tax.

The following was passed unanimously:

"Resolved, That the Farmers' Institute of Northern Virginia heartily approve of the action of the Prince William County Board of Supervisors in 1912 in appropriating money for the corn and tomato club work and hope that they may do the same this year."

J. PEIRPONT MORZAN DEAD

J. Peirpont Morzan, one of the world's greatest financiers, died last Monday at a hotel in Rome. His death was very sudden and came as a great shock to the country. The business houses of J. P. Morgan & Co., were closed last Monday and flags in Wall Street were at half mast soon after word was received that he had died. It is stated that his death will have little or no effect on the market because the recurrent rumors of his serious condition had prepared the market for any possibility. Mr. Morgan was regarded as the master hand of Wall Street affairs and his death will be keenly felt by the money kings of the world. His body was embalmed and will be brought from Rome to the United States for burial.

The spring examination for public school teachers for the year 1913 will be held in the Bennett Building, Manassas, on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, April 24, 25 and 26, beginning promptly at 8 a. m. each day.

The subjects for the first day are: Geography, spelling, grammar and composition, theory and practice of teaching, civil government and reading.

The subjects for the second day are: Drawing, physiology and hygiene, arithmetic, history of Virginia and United States history. Subjects for the third day are: Elementary algebra, science and English history or general history.

The examination in theory and practice of teaching will be based upon Chancellor's Class Teaching and Management in physiology and hygiene and on Ritchie's Manual. Physiology is in reading and drawing, the examinations will be on both methods and subject matter.

In order that proper arrangements may be made for the convenience of the teachers, it is highly important that each applicant notify the division superintendent at least ten days in advance of the examination.
