Then he would like to have Congress take up various other matters and dispose of them rapidly. Among these necessary matters are the currency. Congress has been studying the currency question for some years with the aid of regular and special committees and it has accumulated a large amount of data which will assist the lawmakers in coming to some conclusion as to the exact form of legislation that is desirable. Then there is the woman suffrage question. Recently a delegation of suffragests was received by the President who made no promises but significantly remarked that he considered the question one of great importance. While the reports sent out indicated that the advocates of an amendment to the constitution received rather cold comfort, the fact is that the President seemed really impressed and that he is likely to favor some action by Congress. With women voting on President and Vice-President in nine states and with other states on the brink of giving universal suffrage, this question has been advanced to a place where it cannot longer be ignored.
