GETTYSBURG

Fifty years ago next Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday was fought the higgest, most important and the real decisive battle of the Civil War at the little town of Gettysburg. Pennsylvania. was the only battle of the war fought on Northern soil.

line and about forty miles from Harrisburg, the capital of Pennsylvania. It was founded in 1780 and it was there that Thaddeus Stevens was born. It was neither an aggressive or important town but its topographical features seem to have prepared it to be the arena of one of the greatest battles of history.

Early in June of that year, fifty years ago. after the Army of the Potomac had been so soundly thrashed at Chancellorsville, conditions in the North were in a bad way. Dissatisfaction reigned anthusiasm had begun to cool recognition of the Confederacy by the foreign powers was imminent and the Northern army was about to lose fifteen thousand of its best troops by expiration of their term of service and there was no bright prospect of the reenlistment of so many. It was under the command of General placed just before the battle of Gettysburg by General Meade in whom the troops had great confidence. If the result of this battle had been less decisive than it was there would have been another story to tell but as it was the tide of war immediately began to ebb The Confederacy was exhausted and it was only a question o

Before the war was over plans were made for the preservation and marking of the whole vast battlefield. Fine avenues have been constructed, great observation towers have been built, hun dreds of markers and monuments have been placed. The original topographical features of the field have been maintained. The open spaces have been kept open, thinning groves have been replanted old trees showing the effect of iron hail have been pre served. The returning soidier may be able to recall each sight and sound of the conflict as he finds his way back to his old position. but he will carry away with him an impression of desolation turne to beauty, of strife become peace.
