· A NEW-CHARTER

As Manassas improves and becomes owner or prospective own of various utilities it becomes more and more insistant that she have a new charter. All over the country cities and towns are adopting the commission form of government and we are convinced that it is what we want here. Nine councilmen are too many for the business needs of a town the size of ours and, by nature of their number neglect things that would be attended to by fewer men with more responsibility. With the installation of water, lights and sewerage plants a great number of new rules or ordinances will be necessary for the proper regulation of the different departments connected with the operation which means that the present code -should be revived, codified and made to fit in with a new charter doesn't slop over. that will give us a bettet government. We think a commission of four men with a mayor would be ample. That would give a man for each department with the mayor as general supervisor of the whole. The charter should make ample provision for the recall o an unsatisfactory commission and for the operation of the initiative and referendum. Too many cooks can as easily spoil a municipal broth as any other kind and a commission of four men would be enough to transact all the business of our town and would make it easy to separate the efficient from the unefficient, to place credit for success or failure and to give due credit for good work. Two years is a long enough term for the office of mayor but let the commissioners serve four years and let them be nominated by petition in-

This would not be as great a change from the present gover ment as one might suppose. It would simply make one man sponsible for work that now is managed by three and would make a man-carefully weigh his action before consenting to accept such an office. Also, one four year term would be a fair share for most citizens and a renomination should be dependent upon his desires rather than upon his duty to the commonwealth.

CONGRESS MAKING PROGRESS

Under the guidance of President Wilson the extraordinary session of congress has made a remarkable record. It has already practically enacted a new tariff law, one which is expected to con siderably lower the cost of living because of the reduction in the tariff exactions of about 30 per cent. The present congress has also accomplished what no other congress has been able to and that is to pass a currency bill. True, the bills have not been finally completed, but any amendments made will not materially alter the main provisions of either law. Experts differ as to what will be the effect of the change in the currency system. It has all along been agreed that the system was faulty, but no congress had the nerve to tackle the problem until President Wilson forced the issue at the present session. So far as the tariff is concerned the coun try some time ago discounted the change. When the currency be shall have been finally enacted the country will find that all the dire forebodings were merely for political effect. The bankers will agree with Secretary of State Bryan, who stated to the American Institute of Banking at Richmond, that "banks exist for the accommodation of the public and not for the control of business.". The Owens-Glass bill may not be perfect, but it can be amended, if found defective. Meantime, with enormous crops and with the henks vaults filled with cash the country should be on the high road to prosperity. The only pessimists are the politicians, and the people can be relied upon to bury all pessimists. It is a time for optimism. - National Weekly.
