At the Farmers' Institute held here last Friday, the committee on legislation brought up for discussion a resolution in regard to the State's laws on taxation. Part of the resolution was adopte and it was unfortunate that the time allowed on the program for this discussion was too short to finish the committees' work. Mr. Steere, chairman of the committee, has given the subject of taxa tion a good deal of close study and the general plan that the com mittee is recommending is sound in every particular. It will require elaboration and specification, but the principles embody the basis of the tax laws in three-fourths of our states and especially the states that are meeting the subject of taxation the most successfully and showing the greatest progress in their state institu-
