### TO CURB THE TRUSTS

Every indication points to congress sustaining President Wilson in his desire to have the Panama canal toll exemption clause striken out. This will leave the decks cleared for action on anti-trust legislation. Legitimate business has nothing to fear from the Wilson policy. Investigations of different kinds have developed the fact that many laws have been disregarded by certain interests. The railroads have been giving rebates to big shippers and great financiers have been exposed in their dubious juggling of stocks and bonds belonging to the public. The legislation broposed will simp ly amend the Sherman law so as to make it effective. Guilt is to be made personal. Rebating is to be stopped and all are to be placed upon an equitable basis before the law. That is all which any reasonabe person can expect or demand. Large corporations are necessary under our modern system of business. Because they are immense in their undertakings will be no reason for attack. Big Business has no more right to violate the law than persons engaged in small undertakings, any more than has a large man a greater right to commit crimes than a small man. When the anti-trust laws shall have been enacted the Wilson adminstration will have accomplished more than any half a dozen preceding ones. - National






