





So far as the country is informed, none of the committees of House or Senate have outlined anything resembling a coherent program that will materalize the recommendations of the commission which spent last summer studying the subjet abroad.

Currency reform and the new currency system will be incomplete unless accompanied by adequate relief to the farming population of this country.

Roosevelt. Taft and Wilson are a unit in denouncing the accumulated discriminting whereby the business man in cities finances his enterprises at low rates, while the farmer too often pays extortionate rates of interest. Every member of Congress must know personally of the sore need for adjusting this condition. The slightest familiarity with finance as it is administered in and to ward the rural districts brings conviction. Once make it possible for the large and small farmer to secure credit at nominal, or even reasonable, rates, and the impetus to develop will be difficult to accurately estimate.
