At different times the nations of Europe have approached Germany with propositions to disarm. On every occasion that a "naval holiday" has been suggested the German kaiser replied by increasing his land and sea strength. This compelled England to build two warships to Germany's one. and sother nations were also forced to augment their fighting strength After years of "in times of peace preparing for war" the war has come, and it will be the most ghastly ever fought. It will stagger the world when the fighting ceases and the participants count up their losses without any gains to recompense the sacrifices. Then this country can step forward with a program calling for a general disarmament of every country. The war-worn countries will be willing to listen to appeals to reason, and if the subject is pressed and made the important part of the settlement the world will hereafter have peace. It may be that a sentiment demanding republican form of government will crystalize among the world countries. This would assure peace. Under the constitution of Germany the emperor has the authority to declare war and to enter into peace and other kinds of treaties. The ruler of Austria-Hungary has similar power, but in some other monarcies the warmaking power is vested in the parliaments. The World's Peace Army will undertake to formulate plans seeking general disarmament after the belligerents have quit the battlefield and begun to parley for permanent peace. 
