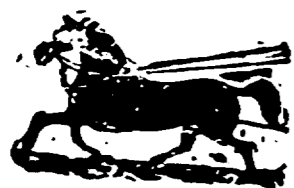

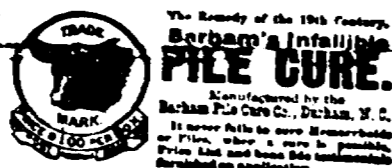

The people of this place have ever been proud of the prosperity of Manassas, and we say this with credit. Still we are inclined to believe that there is no such unqualified effort as there should be, that every individual citizen should be made to grow rather than passively consent to it.

As we need capital and money energy on the part of our people, Personal aims should for the time being be subordinated to the general interests of our town. We are not complaining, all we desire is, to stimulate our people to greater and continued action.

Let some one in our midst suggest a meeting of our town-people and let arrangements be completed with a view to offering inducements to settlers. Some one begin!

The numerical strength of the two parties in the present House of Representatives is the basis upon which it is supposed by the republicans that they can regain control of that body. We see no reason why the democratic should not gain the South and judging from recent elections and the complexion of Western Legislatures there is no cause to feel uneasy.

The Western people can have no sympathy with republicanism and now that the "bloody shirt" has been ignominiously buried, we expect large democratic gains in that section. However, it behooves the people to stick to the nominees. Let us have no local issues in the selection of our congressmen, avoid the independent candidate as you would a viper. Select good and faithful representatives. Return experienced and safe men. Don't kick on old and tried servants to make way for new and possibly inefficient politicians. It is the lack of experience that ruins the legislation of Congress. There is too much talk and gish and too little work indulged in now. We are opposed to a new deal except where efficiency is clearly manifest.

EDITORIAL BRIEFS.

The General Conference of the Southern Methodist Church in Atlanta on Wednesday. All the Bishops were present and two hundred and forty-eight delegates from thirty-seven Conferences. The most important subject of discussion will be the renewal of friendly relations between the Northern and Southern branches of the church. Bishop Egan, president and Judge Jackson of the Supreme court welcomed the Conference.

There is considerable apprehension in Chicago as to possibly the admission of a communistic outlook. It is rumored that an organization exists, somewhat on the labor against capital, and consisting of the above named city of several thousand in number well equipped with arms and determined to resist all authority when their demands are complied with. We hope no such state of things exists, and last year's outbreaks furnish sufficient grounds for apprehending the worst.

The Richmond Wing is mistaken in crediting Judge Senter as being present in Congress in the Virginia District. While all the other counties of this Southern district belong to him, Harrison district, James William is in the First. The Wing however may be excused as some of our citizens judging from the number of letters they claim to have written appear to be interested by a greater degree in the selection of a congressman from that district than the voters themselves.

The Paris Exposition was opened on Wednesday by Marshal McManis, President of France. The display is reported as being very fine and the attendance very large. A number of royal pageants were present. The United States is well represented there, though as yet her exhibits are not all opened.

Another year has nearly passed by since we called the attention of our citizens to the condition of their industry. The answer was not a word that year, and now the passing year of those who left in our confidence is an object of reproach to our people.
