EVIL TENDENCIES

Health Commissioner Asks Clergy of Virginia to Take a Stand for Higher Moral Tone. Recently, addressing the ministerial union of Richmond, Dr. E. E. Williams, state health commissioner, asked the pastors to consider the effects of unchaperoned automobile night rides, immodest dressing and indecent dancing as factors in lowering the moral tone of the young women; and he urged the ministers to use their influence to help the situation. Dr. Williams said: "I wish to talk briefly to you concerning the work of the social hygiene division of the state board of health. It is not because I think moral conditions are worse than ever before, but because there are certain evil tendencies of the present day that need the thoughtful consideration of every minister."

ASKS ASSISTANCE

Volunteer Labor Needed for Erecting Buildings for Fair Grounds—Ask for Copy of Catalog. (H. W. Sanders, Sec.) Prospective exhibitors at the 1921 fair have been assured, ever since the experience of the two preceding years, that their live stock and other exhibits would be protected from the rain and sun. To furnish this protection, it will be necessary to construct a main exhibition building 50x100 feet in size and cattle sheds approximately 30 feet in width by 300 feet in length. It will also be necessary to construct permanent tops over the swine pens.

WINS TWO GAMES

Manassas Defeats Fairfax Saturday and Greenwich in One Game Monday—Loss One Game. Saturday afternoon the Manassas White House Baseball team easily defeated the Fairfax Stationites on the local diamond by a score of 13 to 0. The game was really too one-sided to be interesting. The pitching of Trimmer and the batting of Roland Uterback, however, deserve special mention. Uterback cracked out three hits of a possible four, one of which netted the local team a home run. MEMORIAL PARK

Governors of Three States Pledge Support of Plan to Convert Local Battlefield into Park. (Washington Herald, July 4). Governors of three Southern states, Arkansas, South Carolina and Mississippi, have indicated the plans of the local hosts of the Manassas Battlefield Confederate Memorial Park to construct a memorial park of the battlefield of Manassas, located 33 miles from Washington on the Lee highway. The underwriters from the governors were received by Clarence J. Owens, chairman of the finance board, which is launching a campaign to raise \$50,000 with which to make the park. Gov. Thomas C. McRae, of Arkansas, professed his personal help and support and expressing his belief that the park would be a fitting memorial to the Southern soldiers who were killed in action. Gov. R. A. Cooper of South Carolina and Gov. Lee M. Russell, of Mississippi, also assured Dr. Owens that they would co-operate in the undertaking. (Washington Herald, July 5). Patriotic organizations representing the Southern states are enthusiastically supporting the plan of making a memorial park of the Manassas battlefield, near Manassas, Va., about 33 miles from Washington on the Lee highway. Clarence J. Owens, chairman of the finance board of the proposed Manassas Battlefield Confederate Park, has appealed to the United Confederate Veterans, the Confederate Southern Memorial Association, and the United Daughters of the Confederacy to give their active cooperation in carrying out the undertaking, and the response of these organizations is most encouraging and indicative of the successful accomplishment of the project. K. M. Van Zant, commanding general of the United Confederate Veterans, and reports: "I am very glad to learn of the plan to make a memorial park of the Manassas battlefield. The location is a most proper one. The movement should meet the approval and cooperation of the South. Gen. N. B. Forrest, commander-in-chief of the Sons of Confederate Veterans, said: "One of the greatest mistakes that the South has made is that we have neglected to provide suitable parks commemorating the deeds of our fallen heroes. Most heartily commend the project now being undertaken to establish the Manassas park. I am sure that such a movement will receive the support of our people, and I urge upon all sons and grandsons to contribute liberally to this cause."

FARMERS NEED TO STICK

"Holding Out" is All Important to Make Much Progress. The first of last week, with the help of a government work grader, there was graded for the Manassas wood pool something over 9,000 pounds of wood. It is a very sorry sight to see that bulk of this wood come from Fauquier county. It appears that the wood growers of this county, because their last year's crop is still unsold, could not stick another year and try to help themselves. This is the very thing that has held the farmer down all these years. Nothing is accomplished without plenty of wood-to-h-tiveness, and if you lack the stuff to stick to it until we can get the results, do not stick to it the other fellow for buying your produce for the lowest price he can buy it for. That suits business, and a perfectly honest one. Another object is to encourage the use of the best most practical, and most economical type of grain containers, and to encourage the provision in the home of a variety of nutritious, wholesome food for each family. These jars can be gotten together any merchant who handles glass jars. In determining upon the winner the following points will be taken into consideration: Number of jars in proportion to number of family, 40 per cent; size of jars in proportion to number in family, 20 per cent; variety and practicality of products for canning, 20 per cent; quality, 20 per cent.

SUPERVISORS MEET

Routing of Highway to Fauquier Line Unsettled. All members of the county board of supervisors were present at the meeting of the board held at the court house Wednesday. A warrant was ordered drawn in the sum of \$180, payable to J. C. Albright, resident engineer, for freight on a tractor for Manassas district, chargeable to the apportion road fund. Wm. Crow, T. M. Russell and Chas. R. McDonald were appointed a committee to settle with the treasurer for 1921. It was ordered that a warrant be drawn on the special road fund in the sum of \$5,000 in favor of the county fund.

MILLER TRAIN CONTROL

In the Washington Star of Friday, it was stated that the Miller train control, in which several local people are interested, had been given the approval of the Interstate Commerce Commission. A few days later, W. P. Boardman, chief of the bureau of safety of the commission, came out with the statement that the I. C. C. does not support any device. Further, he said, "the principle of automatic train control is considered by the commission to be well established. Its application is now being investigated. Devices that have been installed are being checked up and daily reports are being received concerning their operation." The Miller train control device has been used by the Chicago and Eastern Illinois railroad for eight years, and has proven satisfactory. Other devices have been on trial operation on other roads for several years, notably on the R. F. and P., from Washington south.

THOMAS FATELY SPOT MONDAY

While camping at Brand's ford, about four miles south of Manassas, over the Fourth, Thomas Fately, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. D. Fately, of Fairview station, was accidentally shot in the abdomen by a fellow camper, Archie Craver. When the accident happened young Fately was lying on the ground near Craver, who attempted to create a revolver from the ground. Before the arrival of a doctor, Luther Sullivan, who resides near the scene of the accident, rendered first aid treatment. Fately was soon moved to his home. It is not known that Fately's wound is serious, and late reports are that he is doing nicely.

ADD TO BATTLEFIELD FUND

Upshur Lecture and U. D. C. Lawn Festival Net Over \$40. An interesting meeting of the Manassas chapter, U. D. C., was held at the home of Mrs. Albert Spieden Wednesday afternoon. After paying all expenses, it was found that the net profit realized from the lecture given a few weeks ago by Congressman W. D. Upshur, of Georgia, was \$23. The lawn festival held at the residence of Mrs. J. H. Herrell cleared \$17.75. Both of these events were given for the benefit of the Manassas battlefield park fund. The big rally planned for July 21 at the battlefield, was the principal topic of discussion. No admission fee will be charged for entrance to the battlefield on the 21st. Lunches and refreshments will be for sale, a convenience for those who do not carry their dinners. The next meeting of the chapter will be at the home of Col. and Mrs. R. G. Hutchison on the afternoon of August 3.
