This is a one-and-one-half story, brick, gable roofed dwelling which exhibits Cape Cod stylistic elements such as gable dormers, a steep pitched roof, and a symmetric facade.

A single story, brick, gable roofed wing is located on the west elevations. The east porch has been enclosed.

Relationship of Secondary Resources to Property:

The inground pool was constructed in 1959-60. The single story, frame, henhouse has 6/6 double hung windows. The two bay, single story, brick garage has no doors. Attached to the east wall is a shed-roofed carport. The barbeque is made of brick and sits on a concrete pad. All of the resources are situated south and east of the house.

DHR Historic Context: Domestic

Significance Statement:

Mr. Armstrong moved to the area in 1936. He and his wife admired a house in Groveton and subsequently, had a North Carolina contractor build it for them. They moved in in 1942. Although it is over fifty years of age the house is neither architecturally nor historically significant. It is not eligible for

National Register inclusion.

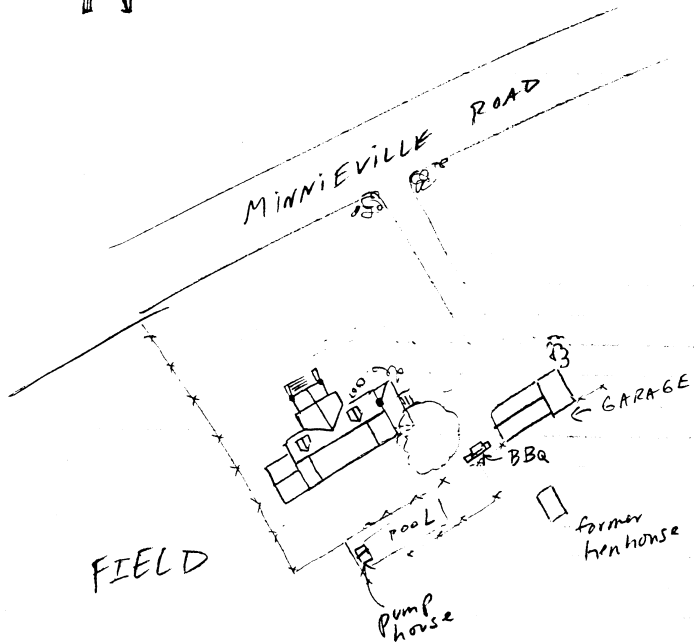
