Know yee that I Samuel Jackson & Mary my wife of the County  
of Prince of William for divers causes and considerations but more  
especially for the regard and Love I have for the Baptist Society  
Having given granted and confirmed and by these presents do fully  
freely & absolutely give grant and confirm unto the said Society a  
certain piece or parcel of land and is bounded as followeth Beginning  
at a red oak sapling on the south side the road by the meeting house  
then S. 77° W 45 p. to a Stone in the frame of the meeting house  
spring then S. 13° E 2 p. to a white oak sapling then N. 77° E 45 p.  
to a Stone on the south side of s. road then down s. road S. 10° W 12 p.  
to the road leading from the Occoquan Mills then down the s. road  
N. 79° E. 20 p. to a stone, then S. 10° E 18 p. to a double body'd red  
oak then N. 80° W. 19 p. to two red oak saplings then S. 10° W. 9 p.  
to the Beginning including about three acres Together with every  
advantage that may be usefull to the said Society for ever. And moreover
