Description:

This is a three-bay, hipped roof brick building that has been renovated for use as a modern bank. The original arched windows are visible on the southeast corner. There is a wide banded frieze on the cornice and wide overhangs.

Condition: Remodeled

Threats to Resource: Transportation Expansion

Additions/Alterations Description:

It appears that shortly after the original building was built, it was doubled in size by adding onto the back. There are seams in the brick, frieze and soffit which indicate the building was originally half its present size. The brickwork around most of the original windows was reworked, and shorter, wider six-over-six sash windows were inserted. A modern Colonial Revival architrave was placed around a paneled recessed entrance on the front. A small one-story block shaped addition was built on the back northeast corner.

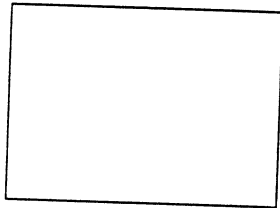

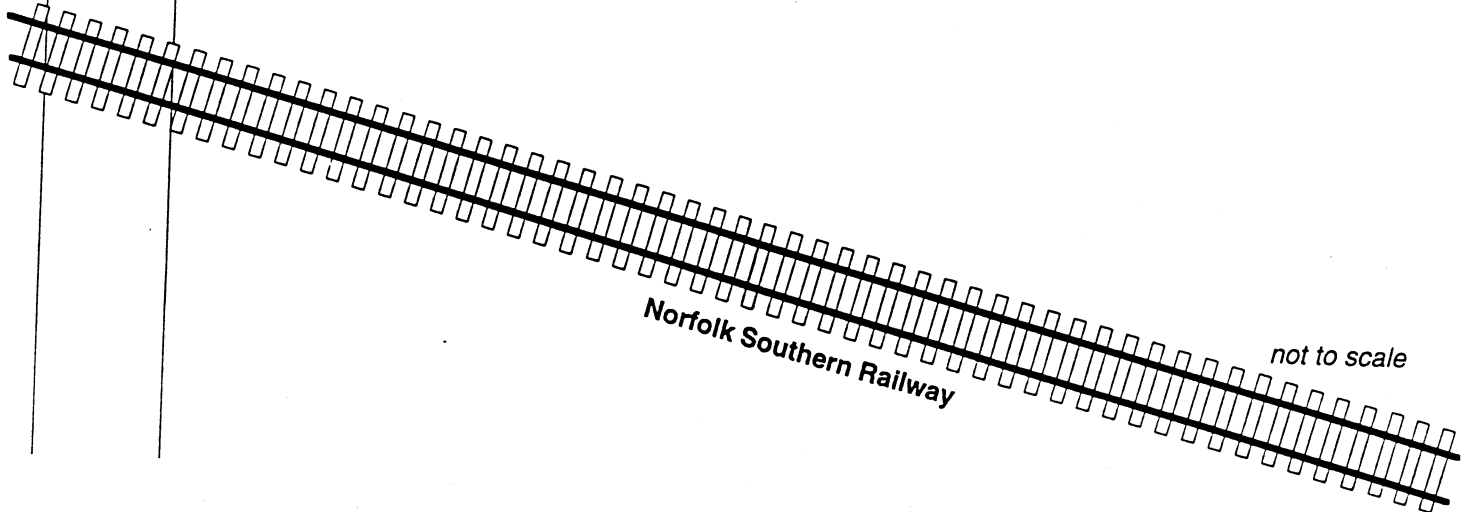
