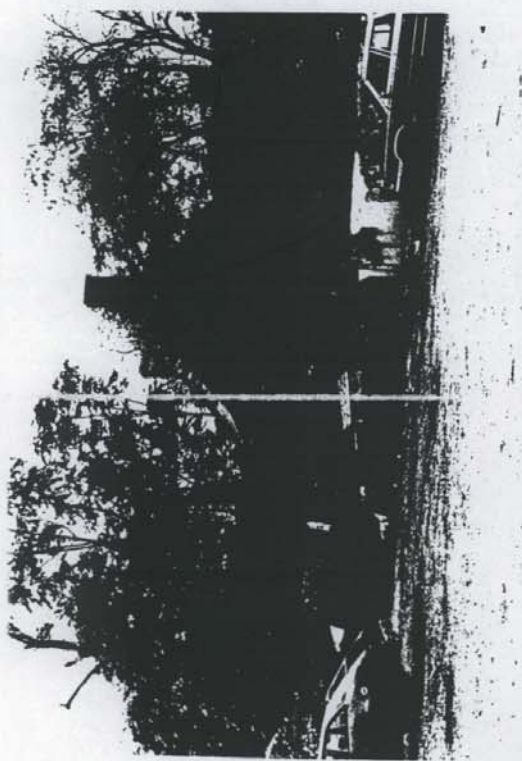

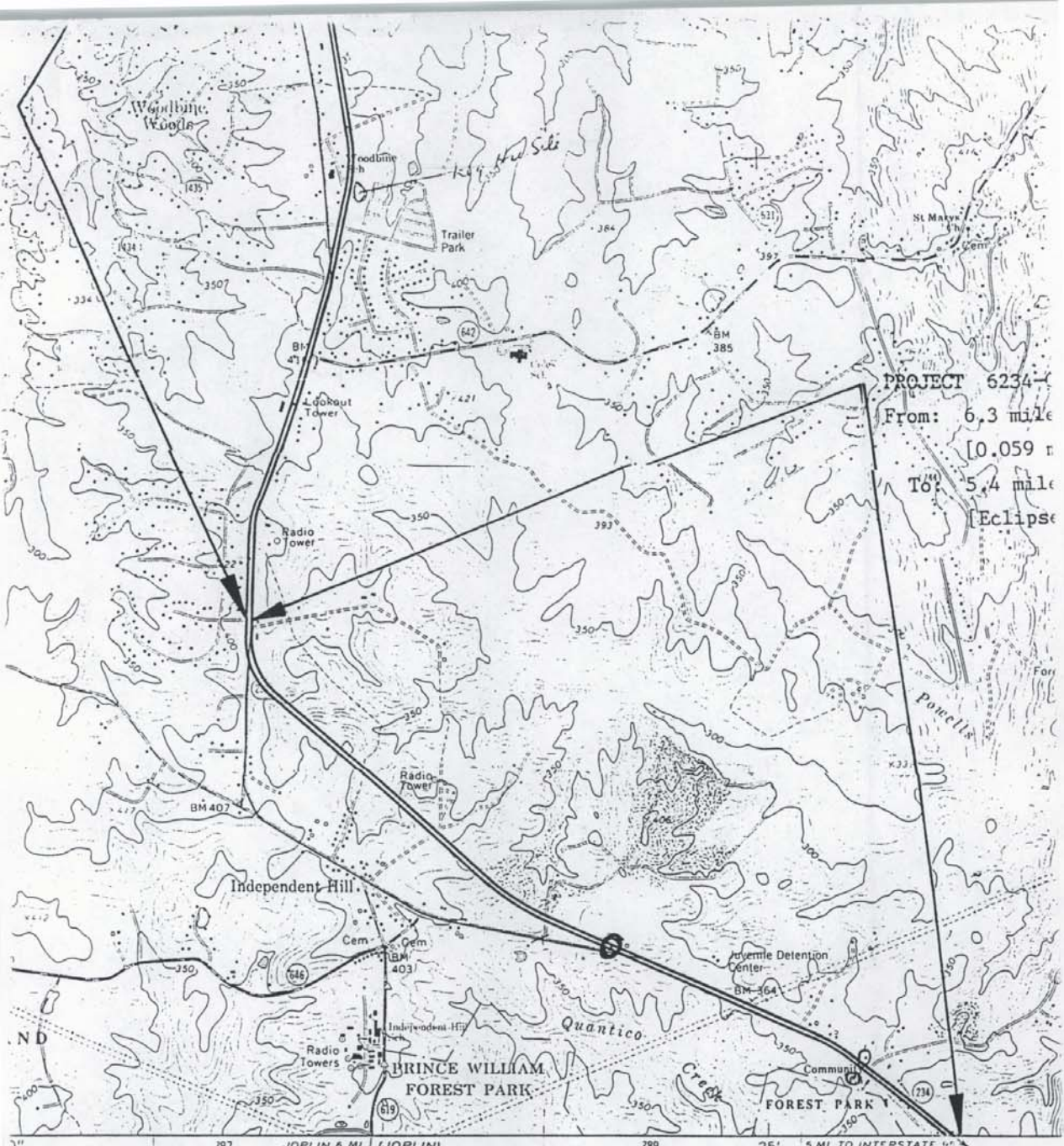

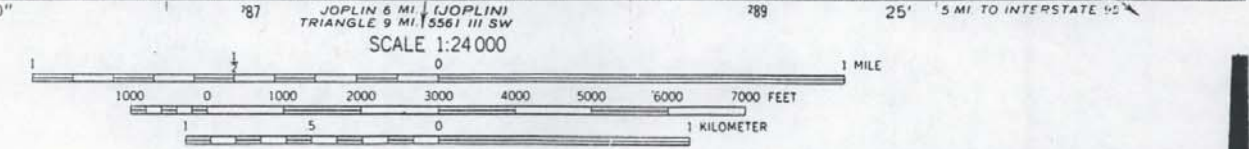
Drawing of Plan
