
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A History of 14020 Fitzwater Drive




As far back as the early 1800's the parcel of land home to the present day house at 14020 Fitzwater Drive was known as Belleview. The 600 acres had long been owned by the Ewell family. Captain Charles Ewell Jr., and his wife Sarah, were among the first to settle in Prince William County, in the period 1739 and 1747. The Ewells were a military family and many served in the Civil War with distinction. In 1822, Dr. Thomas Ewell received the land from his parents. He was a respected physician and scientist and published two books "Ewell's Family Medicine" and "The First American Chemistry Text for the Non-Scientist".

Belleview is documented in the book "Prince William – the Story of Its People and Its Places" (pages 150 and 151):

"Right from Nokesville 1.0 m. on County 652 is the SITE OF BELLEVILLE, the home of Solomon Ewell; it was later a home of Thomas Ewell, the father of General Richard S. Ewell and Benjamin S. Ewell, president of the College of William and Mary. The old brick house, now gone for many years, was named Stony Lonesome after the War between the States, when boys attending school here, thought the name more suitable to the stony nature of the ground and the general air of loneliness that pervaded the place. Solomon Ewell, by will recorded in 1818, left his property in trust to James E. Heath for the benefit of his wife, Mary Ball Ewell. In 1893 Benjamin S. Ewell sold his third interest to R. Ewell Scott."

In the mid-1800's the land was affectionately known by locals as the "Old Field" and remained within the Ewell family. During the civil war several members of the Ewell family served in the military – including Lieutenant General Richard S. Ewell. He graduated from West Point in 1840 and initially served in the western frontier and then the war with Mexico. He lead armies for the Confederacy through-out the northern Virginia area. The map below was hand-drawn by scouts for the military to aid in war planning and logistics. The red mark indicates the approximate location of the current day property.



Over time, the land was partitioned off – one 319 acre portion became known as "Rock Smith Farm" in the 1880's. For a time the land was merged together again – joining a property known as "Greenville".

In 1881-83, the Manuel family purchased 317 acres of the original Ewell estate. In 1899, William Manuel gave a 38 acre portion of the property that was to become the present day 14020 Fitzwater drive to his son Richard Manuel. At that time the land contained only an old barn. In 1903, the Manuels built the present day house (consisting of the kitchen, dining room, and entire 2nd floor, out of hand cut rough hewn lumber on top of a field stone foundation.

Many years later the property had fallen into disrepair. For many decades it was owned by the McWhorter family and an early photo from an airplane, taken in 1937, shows how the land looked:



In 1962, a young Charles Rector bought the property and lived in the current house. His company "Rector Construction" developed the land into several residences and sold them off. Once the development was complete this house was sold with 34 acres and he moved on.

Today Rector Construction Company is a multi-million dollar construction company serving the Northern Virginia area.


In 1971, the Mintz family bought the property (now in its current 13.54 acre form) and restored it to farming use – adding the present day fencing and purchasing their first tractor from McMichael's in Nokesville. They also built the present day barn out of old oak from a previous structure. The property changed hands several times in the 1980's – during which two additions were built (the present day living room and master suite). During this time, Prince William County renumbered the streets in the county – prior to this, the property had been known as 14204 Fitzwater. After the renumbering it became the present day 14020 Fitzwater.

Today, the forest has regrown along the back property line – beyond the existing barb-wire fencing you will find another, older, barb-wire fence that literally runs through several existing trees (the trees grew up and around the fencing). This marks the actual property line. In 2009, the current owner bought the property as a short sale and renovated the property extensively with his Dad. Coincidently, he bought his first tractor from McMichael's. After finishing the renovations (and before learning his job was moving out-of-state) he spent many a dusty afternoon in the courthouse basement and local libraries thumbing through old deed books and articles researching the history of the house and surrounding area.


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

Note: these boundary maps were created by the author – translating the "metes and bounds" in the old deed books into latitude and longitude. An example of the boundary description in one of the old deed books is:

"Beginning at a stone where a double red oak recently stood, but which has now fallen down, and running thence with the center of the road S.84 45 E. 76.30 poles to a point in the road in line with a stone planted at an angle to the road [...] from the center of a marked walnut tree [...]"
