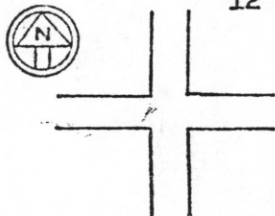

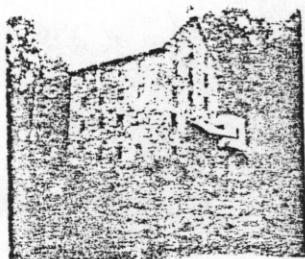

Confederates. Southern Troops, occupying Manassas in 1861-62, established a meat-curing plant here. The mill was burned (interior only) by the Confederates so that the enemy could not use the meats. William Beverley restored the mill after the war and used it for making plaster.
