Marcus Sterling Hopkins a union officer from Berlin Ohio. after the war became Freedmen's Bureau Officer in charge of Prince William County, Virginia.

Purchased a farm shortly after war, but had to sell it because of poor health.

Rem. in P.W.C until Feb 1867. then transf. to Gordonville as officer in charge of Orange + Louisa Counties.
