On behalf of the Commonwealth, it gives me great pleasure to inform you that the Virginia Board of Historic Resources has placed Brentsville Historic District on the Virginia Landmarks Register and has endorsed its being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places. The Virginia Landmarks Register was established by an act of the General Assembly in 1966 and includes "the buildings, structures, and sites which are of statewide or national significance." 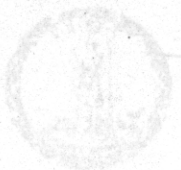
