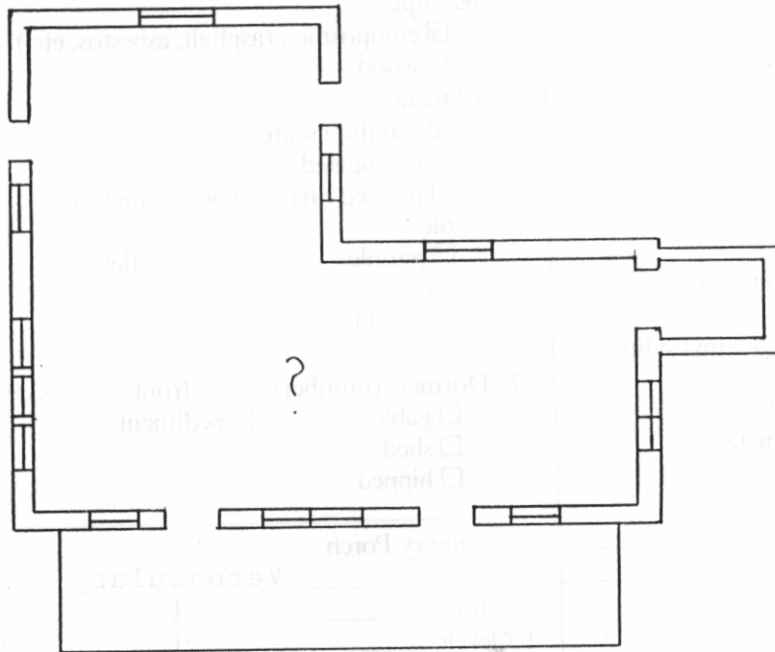

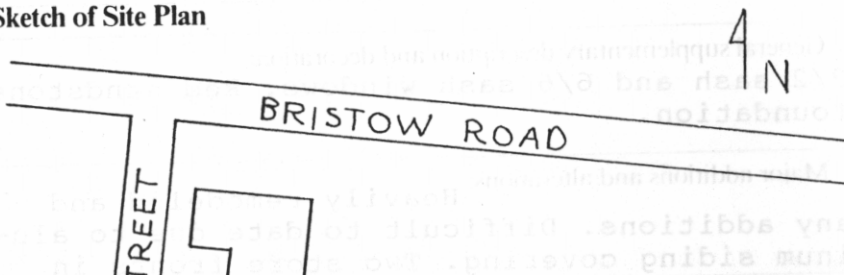

Drawing of Plan



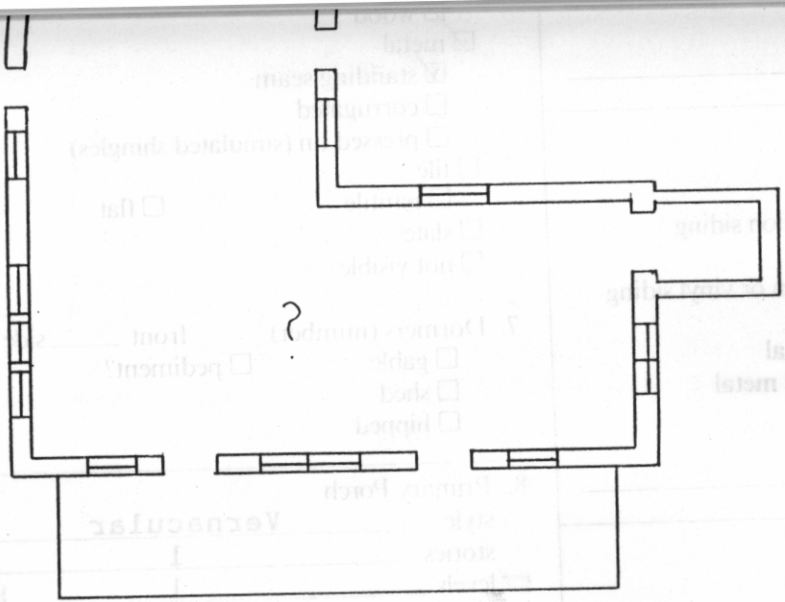
Sketch of Site Plan



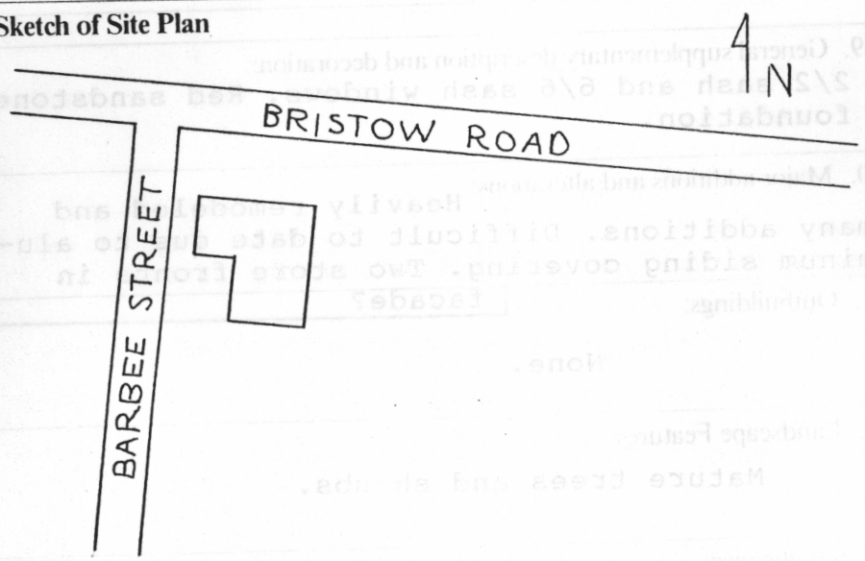
