Everett B. Chamberlain, 59, a former Air Force officer and a retired pilot and biologist for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, died of cancer Friday in Mercer, Maine.

Mr. Chamberlain, who lived at 12303 Fir Tree La., Bowie, was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross with 10 Oak Leaf Clusters for his service as a flight commander in the European and Pacific theaters in World War II.

In 1949, he transferred to the Air Force Reserve and became a pilot and biologist for the Delaware Game and Fish Department. His flying duties for the department included surveys of water fowl migrations.

In 1959, he joined the Fish and Wildlife Service of the U.S. Interior Department. He worked in Texas for three years and then moved to the Washington area in 1962.

He worked at the Patuxent Research Center and at the Interior Department and continued aerial waterfowl surveys. Some of his surveys took him to Canada.

Mr. Chamberlain was born in Jackman, Maine. He earned a bachelor's degree in forestry from the University of Maine and a master's degree from Pennsylvania State University.

He retired from the Air Force Reserve as a lieutenant colonel in 1971, and from the Interior Department in 1974.

Mr. Chamberlain's survivors include his wife, Marie, of the home in Bowie; four sons, Everett B. II, of Phoenix, Ariz., Alfred and Roger, both of the home in Bowie, and Eric, of Mercer; his mother, Nellie Bacon Chamberlain, of Mercer at whose home he died; two brothers and a grandchild.
