Since last muster have been in same camp about five [miles] east of Orange Court-House, Virginia.

*Stationed at camp near Brandy Station, Virginia, September-October 1863.*

*Stationed at camp near Raccoon Ford, Virginia, November-December 1863.*

*Stationed at New Market, April 30-August 31, 1864.*

There being no officers of the company present and the books and papers having been lost, it is impossible to make out the roll according to regulations.

*Stationed at Camp Stafford, Virginia, September-October 1864.*

*Station not stated, not dated.*

May 9, 1861.— The "Creole Guards" was organized in the city of Baton Rouge, Louisiana on May 9 and has participated in all the battles and skirmishes and marches in which the regiment has taken part, having never been detached on any other service.

This record is as correct as can be obtained through the agency of Julius Foster, Charles D. [Bourg], and [John Daily] Burk, the only members of Company A present.

*Stationed at Camp Carondelet, Virginia, November-December 1861.*

December 17.— The company marched from Camp Florida near Centreville, Virginia to Camp Carondelet, about six miles.

*Stationed at Camp Carondelet, Virginia, January-February 1862.*

*Station not stated, [March]-August 1862.*

*Stationed near White Post, September-October 1862.*

*Stationed at camp near Port Royal, November-December 1862.*

*Stationed at Camp Ewell, Virginia, January-February 1863.*

*Stationed near Hamilton Crossing, [March 1]-May 14, 1863.*

*Stationed near Rapidan Station, May [15]-August 31, 1863.*

*Stationed near Rappahannock Station, September-October 1863.*

*Stationed at camp near Raccoon Ford, Virginia, November-December 1863.*

*Stationed at New Market, April 30-August 31, 1864.*

Owing to the loss of all company papers, the date, place of enlistment and by whom and the date of last payment have been left blank in some places.

*Stationed in front of Petersburg, March 24, 1865.*

June 1-23, 1861.— This company was organized in New Orleans. Mustered in the state service on June 1 and on June 23 mustered in the Confederate States service as Company B, Eighth Louisiana.

July 1.— Arrived at Manassas on July 1.

July 18-21.— Though not actively engaged at the battles of July 18 and July 21. The regiment was at Blackburn's Ford on Bull Run, exposed to the shelling from the enemy's batteries on the north side of the stream.

In September the regiment was formed with the Sixth, Seventh, Ninth, and Wheat's Battery and was known as Taylor's Brigade.

The company was present in every engagement that the regiment was in having followed Stonewall Jackson in the memorable Valley Campaign.
