This small family cemetery is located at Limstrong, just south of the intersection of the Brentsville Road (S. R. 649) and the Dumfries Road (S. R. 234). The cemetery is located on a hill south of S. R. 234, but the cemetery is not visible from the road. The abandoned roadbed of the Dumfries Road runs alongside the base of the hill upon which the cemetery sits.

Interior inspected? N/A

Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.)

The cemetery contains at least 20 markers, many of them toppled, denoting graves of the Taylors, Hixsons, Joneses, and Clarks. The earliest burials date to the 1850s.

Thomas Jones (1820-1903) and his wife, Martha (1821-1900), gave land in the Bradley Forest area for two churches and a public school.

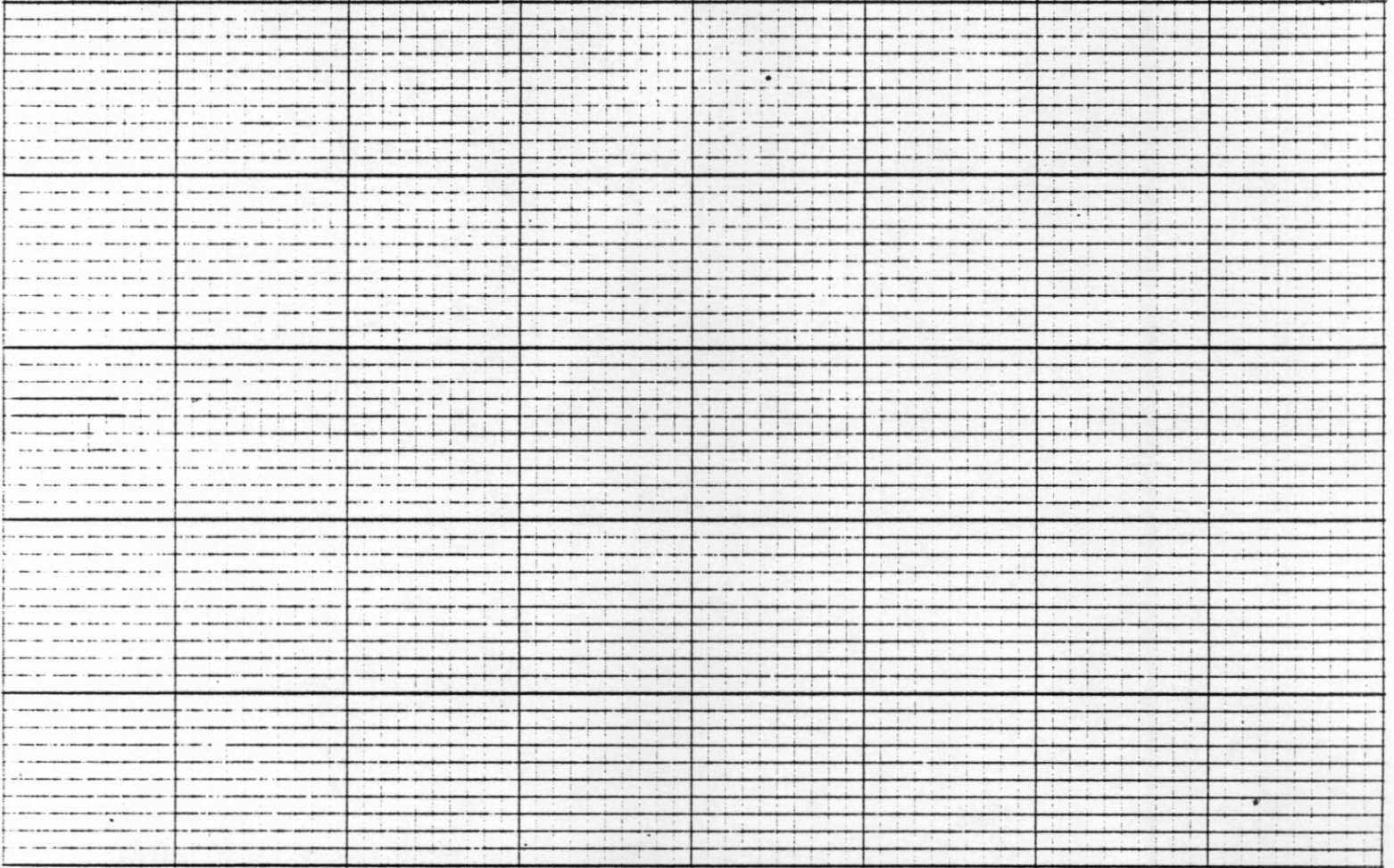

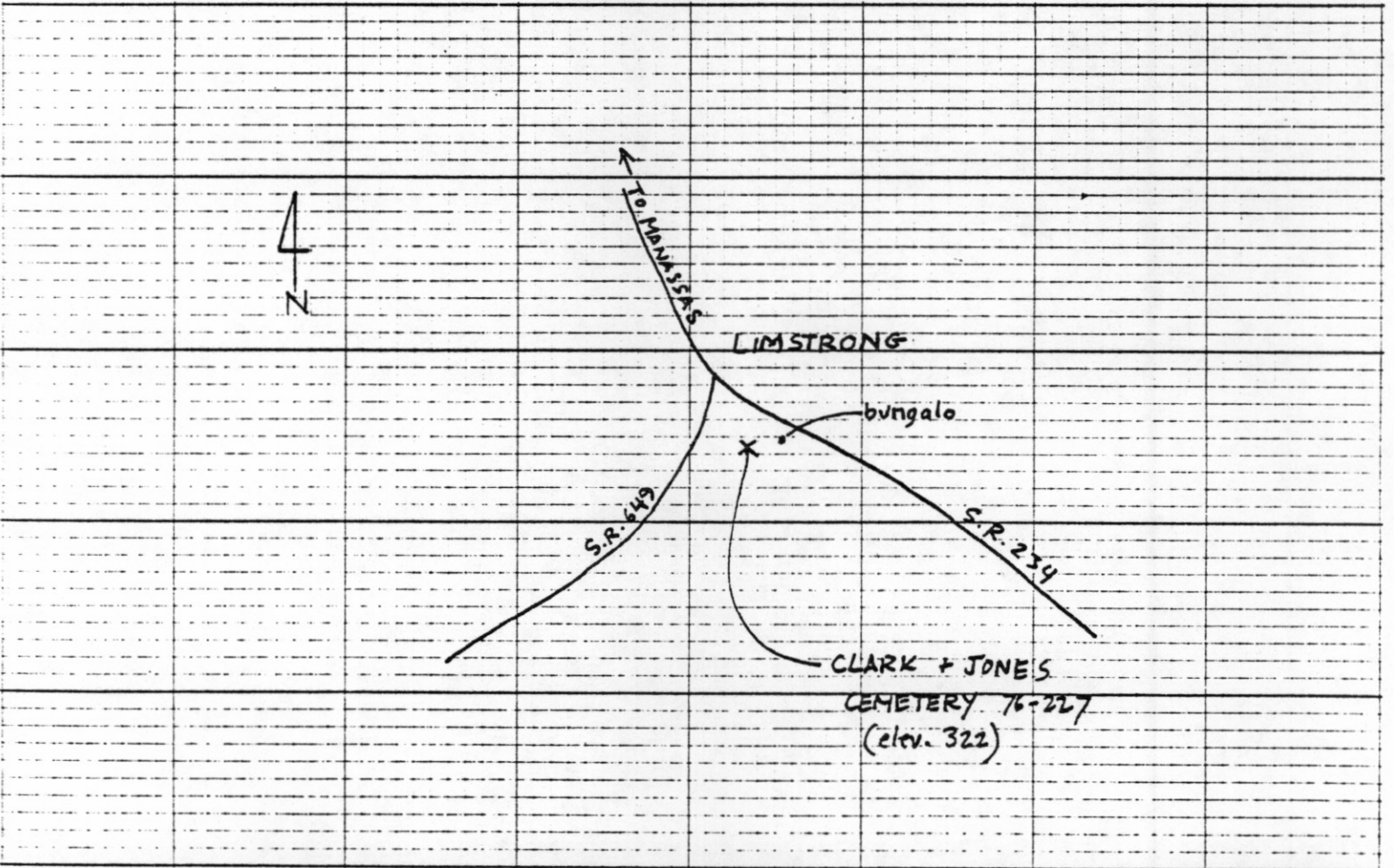

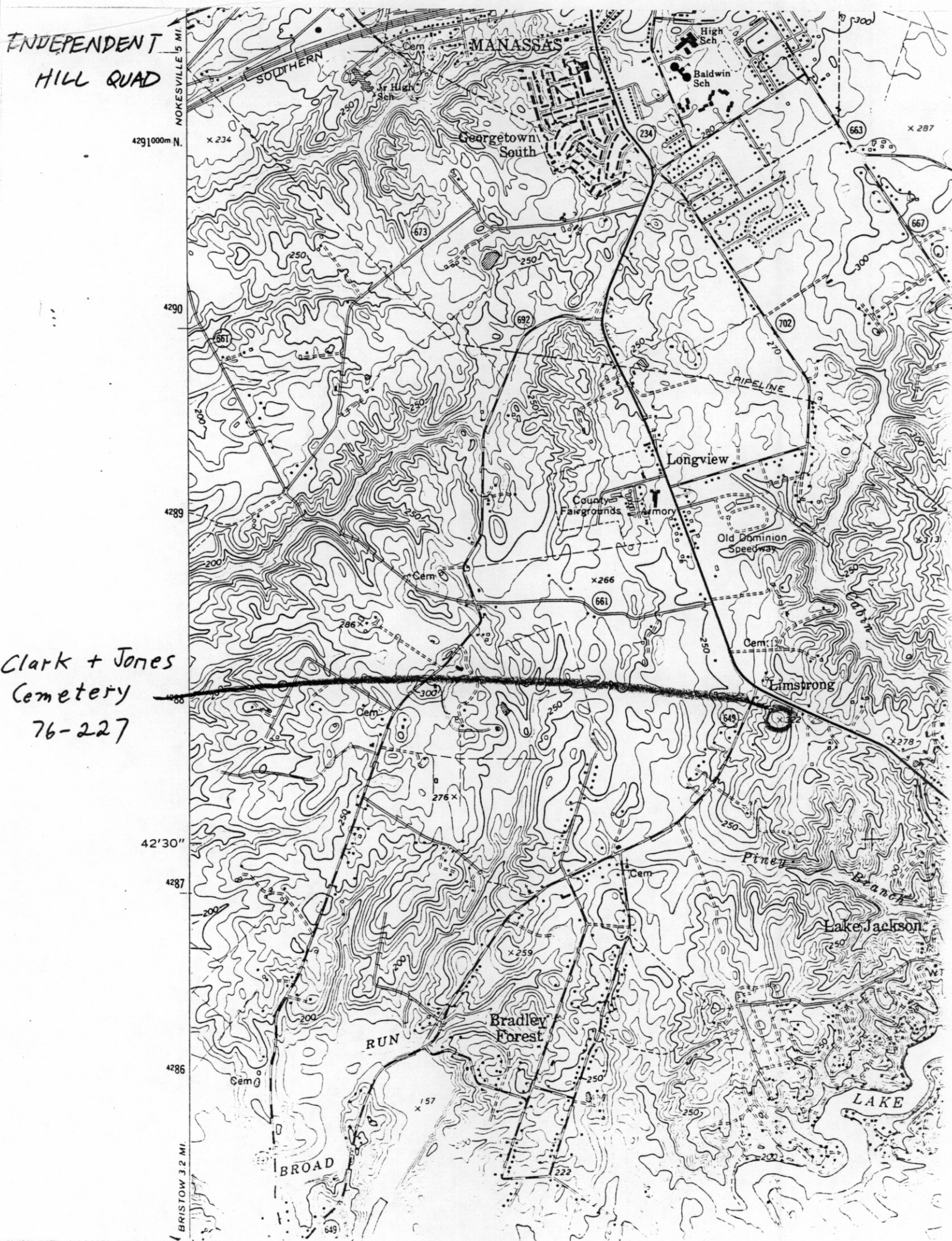
