Fratercangelo remembers his first impression of the local course. He said, "I loved the layout of the course and its character, but I was concerned about the challenges of improving the clubhouse."

Fratercangelo outlined the next challenges that face the golf course and the Park Authority: rebuilding the pro shop to accommodate food sales, clothing sales, and collection of green fees.

The current shop is located in the original farmhouse on the property. Fratercangelo believes the 19th century house will require significant modernization, from its current multiple small room layout, to create a larger shop and dining lounge. If the house is not used for the new pro shop, county professionals will need to identify and begin construction on another location near the current house.

However, Fratercangelo touts the club as a good course for locals. He said, "We provide a combination of a quality product with employees who make an effort to let our guests feel comfortable in a great environment, and all for a very reasonable cost."
