Only a very small portion of a rubblestone foundation wall remains of the Clyde or Bodine Mill. This is located on the edge of the pond which is to the east of the existing house. Remnants of the mill race can still be seen in the field to the east of the house, and a 20th century concrete dam is located approximately 1/2 mile east of the existing house on Broad Run. A concrete levy, now toppled is located in the mill race, close to the existing pond. The site of an early log house and an old smokehouse were located on a knoll overlooking the pond to the west. This was probably the original Bodine house. These sites were destroyed to build the existing house and an outdoor fireplace, circa 1950.

(Note - The actual mill site is probably in the Nokesville Quad., the dam is located on Broad Run in the Gainesville Quad.)

Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.)

The Clyde or Bodine Mill was built just north of Langyher's Mill on Broad Run in the 19th century. It appears on the 1901 "Map of Prince William County" by W. H. Brown. The merchant flour mill was remodeled in 1911 by John Hall, and again in the 1920's by Roy Lunsford. The mill closed down sometime in the 1930's. The current owner, Mrs. Bertha Ferguson, demolished the remains of the foundations, to make way for a pond, which was constructed in the 1950's. She also demolished the house, part of which was log, and the original smokehouse, to make way for a new house.

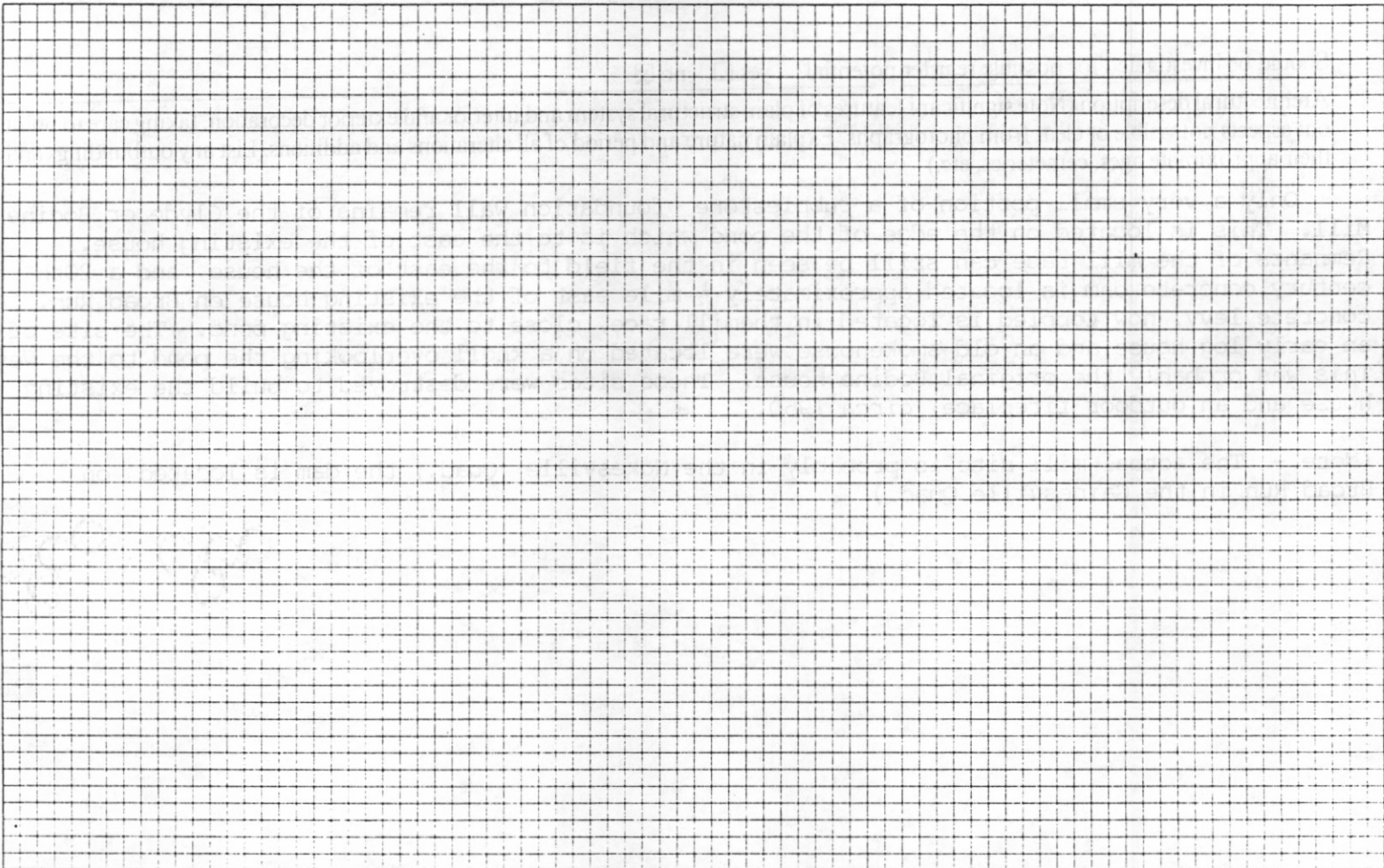

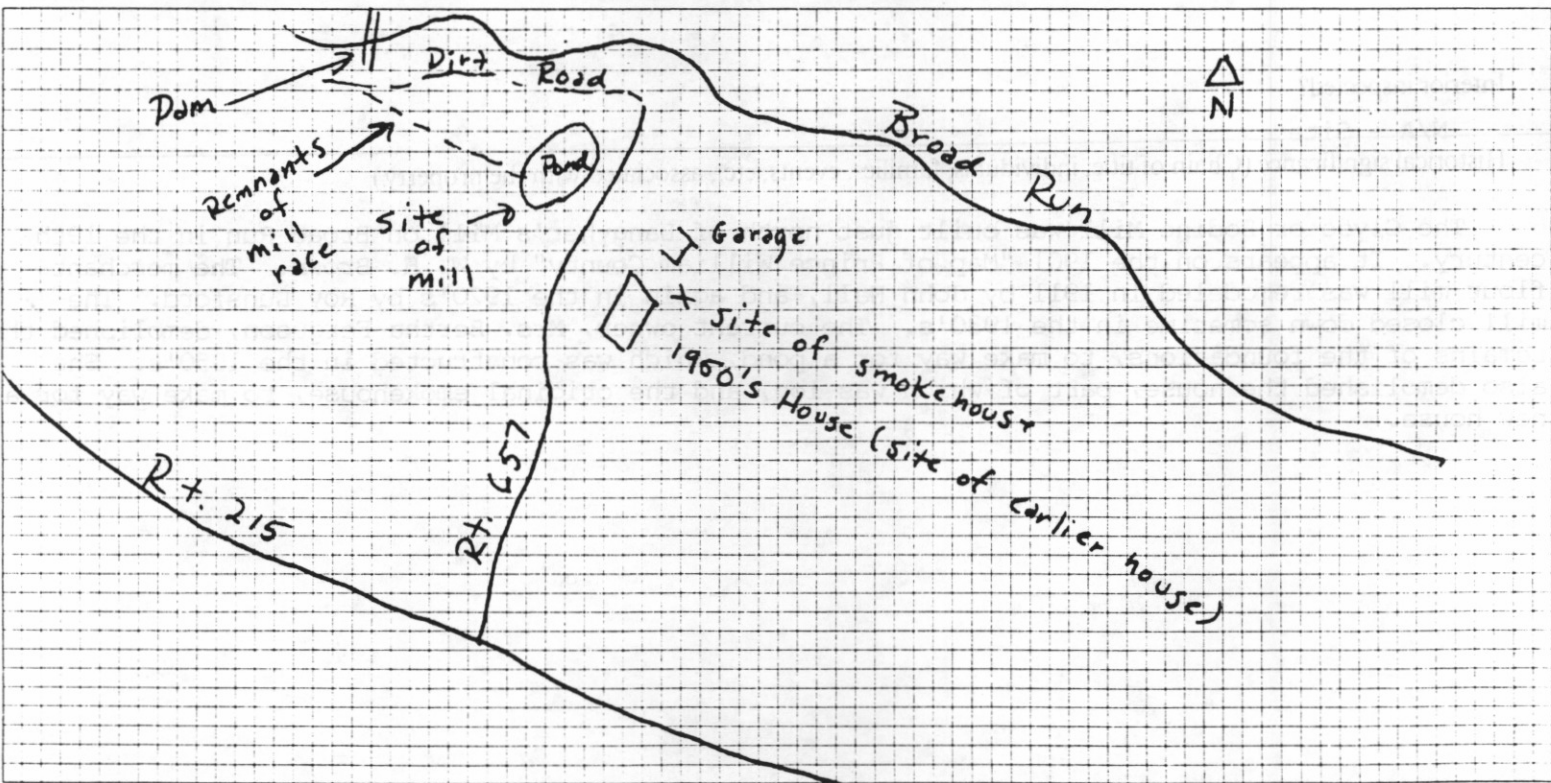
