


Clerk's Office, Cte.Hse: Births and Deaths 1864-1870, 1913-, Marriages 1856-Va. State Liby. (Dept. of Vital Records copy): Births 1877-1896, Deaths 1853-1896, Marriages 1854-1935. (Not available on interlibrary loan)
Marriage bonds prior to 1854 are lost (Courthouse was ransacked in 1863).
Ages and birthdates may be gotten from indentures (Dettingen vestry book), court minutes, voter registration lists (beginning ca.1900) and burial records (1931-). (Draft of Baker Funeral Home records, 1931-1969, available at PW Library.)
