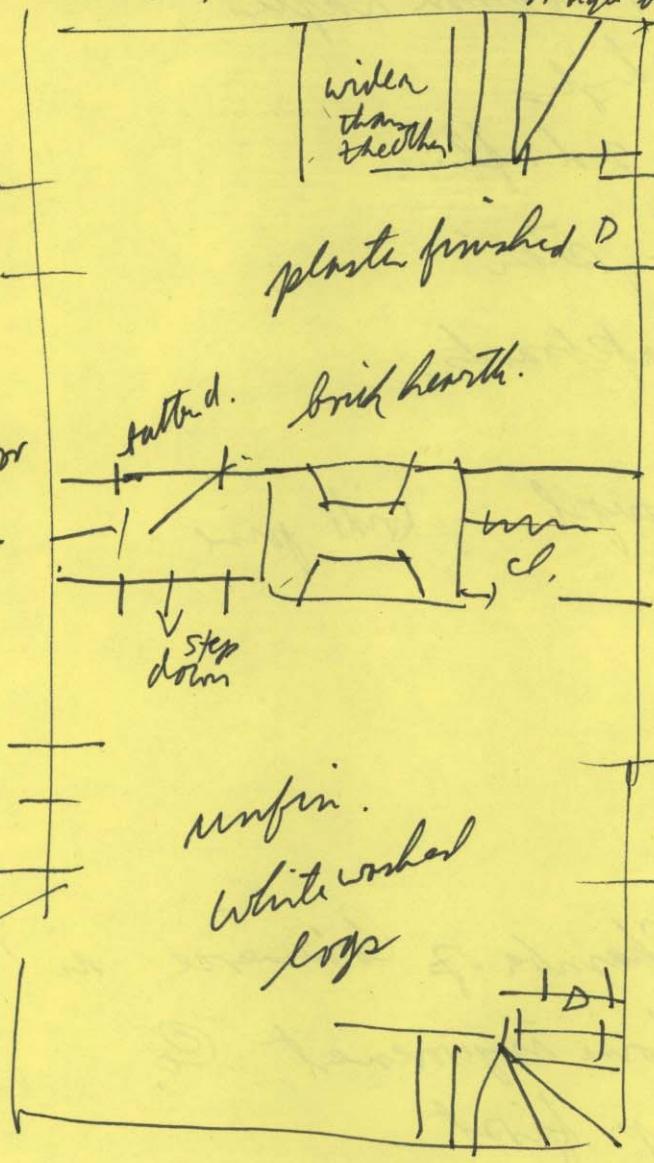

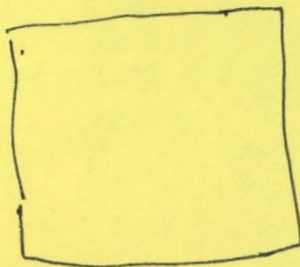

The last occupants left the house in 1904  
& remained unchanged until 1948 when the  
1881-82 addition was removed.

HABS recorded the bldg. in 1959, completely - 2 sheets of  
measured drawings.

Chimney is 5'0" deep.



There was an old log kitchen to the  
right of the W.H. Dogan House.

The original bldg. was a single-room, (log),  
gable roofed structure w/ a fireplace loc. mid-way  
in the north wall. It had one window in  
the center of the west wall & a door in the  
center of the east wall. Then in 1860 a  
frame bldg. was moved to Groveton from the  
Peach Grove estate. Then the chimney was changed,  
loc. of doors & windows changed, stairs rebuilt.  
new weatherboard & trim & interior finished.

There was a small porch at one time on the  
east side of the <sup>1st</sup> frame addition

In July 1950 the Washington Home Improvement Co.,  
on a contract to the NPS., removed much  
valuable woodwork, floors, chair rails, trim,  
mantels, etc. during "stabilization work."

The stone foundation was repaired + repointed in 1948.  
w/ gray portland cement. The chimney was  
rebuilt w/ gray portl. cement

Report says the log section settled c 2 feet +  
separated from the frame addition.

Home was purchased by P.W.C. Chamber of Commerce from W.H. Dogan IV or V  
15 Sep. 1947. Home was in <sup>near</sup> ruinous condition.

According to a report by NPS employee A.J. Higgins.  
Chamber of Commerce demolished a "non-historic" part  
of the house in summer of 1948 and made general  
repairs to preserve the house until a full restoration could be done.

1 Nov 1948 George B. Cooke, Chair of the Chamber's  
Dogan House Committee wrote Supt. James Myers  
that they were ready to convey the house to NPS.

4,914 square feet + the house was don. 27 Aug 1949  
for to USA for addition to MNBP.

Significance in Battle 2d Mon. p. 47 of Crowson's History.

Wm H. Dogan Home was loc. at interest of Warrington  
Turnpike + Audley Rd (Rt. 622). Dogan Home was  
in the forefront of heavy fighting. Aug 29-30, 1862

Dogan home was caught in heavy cross artillery fire.  
One shell came through a door on the west side  
of the frame section + scarred the floor.

Ownership of ~~Groveton~~ Dogan House Land.

~~Wm~~ Henry Dogan, <sup>died 1824,</sup> purchased in the late 18<sup>th</sup> century several hundred? acres from Mann Page

The land passed to his wife Mary Wheeler Dogan.

in 1832 the home tract at Groveton and at her death ~~it~~ went to his oldest child

Wm Henry Dogan<sup>I</sup>, with the balance to be divided among the surviving children.

Wm Henry Dogan increased the size of the estate.

2d wife Lucinda M. Lewis

Wm Henry died in 1854.

Wm Henry's principal plantation was Peach Grove - which estate contained 586 acres.

There were 8 children from that marriage & 1 daughter from an earlier marriage.

Lucinda, the widow rec. the main Peach Grove tract 120 A. + woods, 50 A. w/ bldg. she lived to be 93. d. in 1910.

Wm. Henry Dogan<sup>II</sup> b. 1847 <sup>d. 1899</sup> inh. his mother's portion. Married Mary Ellen Benson

Their son Wm. Henry<sup>III</sup> b. 1887 inh. the prop.

which passed to his 4 children.

main house was destroyed by fire in 1860

It was loc. about 400 yards northwest of  
this house,

The log cabin on the site had served as quarters  
for the overseer. <sup>IN 1860,</sup> It was joined w/ a frame house dragged to  
the site to accommodate Mrs. D. + her children.

The orig. estate consisted of 700+ acres

which dur. the Civil War was held jointly by

Lucinda Dozan + 7 children.

This plot (on which the Dozan House stands) was  
the last of the estate sold off by Dozan heirs

There were several major building periods on the  
W.H. Dozan estate 1817-1819, 1840-1845,  
1856-1860, 1881-1882.

W.H. Dozan could have built both bldgs., dating  
the time of erection to either 1817-19 or 1840-45.

W.H. Dozan III lived at the house in 1881-82.

He constructed a 2-room, shed-roofed addition  
across the rear of the house to the west. as a  
kitchen + adtl. bedroom.

Annapolis was built in 1893 by John A. Cannon  
father of Ira Cannon.

Dogan House — "Ratcliffe Goes to rescue of Historic Dogan House;  
Last mark of the Second Battle of Manassas" ??  
Deeded to P.W.C. Chamber of Commerce [in c 1950s]  
by Mr. & Mrs. W. H. Dogan, whose family  
occupied the house during the battle.

Chamber will retain title until it can be gotten  
to recondition + properly preserve it before it  
is turned over to the incorp. into the MNBP
