1 Brentville, the accompanying plat of the Town I traced from the origin and will from time to time fill in the various lots, there were some of the notable people of the County lived there while it was the County Seat, General Epa Hunton and others but I am not yet sure of the exact location

"Pursuant to the direction of John McGrae, John Gibson, John Fox, Richard Davis, Sen. John Hooe, John Leachman, Charles Hinton and Benj. Johnson, Gent. appointed by an act of the General Assembly to lay out a town at the Court House, in Prince William County, to contain 50 acres, including the six acres for the Public Square and the <sup>Tavern</sup> ~~Town~~ lot.

Mason Locke Weems bought of Wm Linton and John McGrae, Directors of the Town of Dumfries, lot number 31, 1728, it was here that he had his bookshop, which was a gathering place for the scholars of the day, and it is also said that upon occasion he could make merry with his fiddle.

1778 Gustavus Brown of Charles Co, in the State of Maryland, Esq. and Margaret Brown; his wife, and Micheal Lazee, bought four lots in the Town of Dumfries nos. 27.28.31.32, opposite the lots of Charles Adams and Wm Brent, Sold to Brown by Trustees of the Town of Dumfries, lots 31.28 were later leased to Thos Aiken, apothecary, for one pepper corn a year, payable on Lady Day.

Lots 29.30 were owned by Thomas Masterson, a shipscarpenter, and occupied by him as such, bought of John Langsett, a cooper by trade, for the sum of 50 lbs.

Lot 67 was sold to Henry Lee Jun. by Toushee Tebbe, "agreed that he shall build and finish in the said lot a house of brick, stone or well framed timber, <sup>ft</sup> 24 and 9 in. pitch" This was Lighthouse Harry Lee, there does not seem to be evidence that he kept this property very long, but have not able to locate the transfer, if any.

Wm Cunningham of the City of Glasgow bought of Toushee Tebbe and Wm Carr, for eighty pounds current money, 2 lots in the Town of Dumfries. 80 .82.

Lot 175 office of the Tobacco Inspector.

"This indenture made the 18th day of April in the year of our Lord 1777 between Colin Dunlop and Imos, his son, of the City of Glasgow, and James Wilson and James his son of Cumberland in that part of Great Britian called Scotland, and Alexander Campbell of the Town of Dumfries, County of Prince William, and Commonwealth of Va, of the one part, and John Gibson of the Town Of Colchester, Merchant, of the other part. Witnesseth: that for certain consideration and the sum of forty pounds sterling money of Great Britian. to the said Alex<sup>in</sup> Campbell, attorney in fact for the other parties, 4 lots of 1/2 acre of land ~~adjoining~~ <sup>in</sup> an old feild adjoining the Town of Dumfries. rear of lots 102.111
