

This Deed made and entered into this 21st day of June 1881 between Henry J. Duty of Prince William County State of Virginia of the one part and Lucius St. Bailey, Stephen Nash, and John W. Jackson trustees of a New School Baptist Church to be built in the town of Occoquan, and named Ebenezer of the other part. Witnesseth that the party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of thirty five dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof he does hereby acknowledge, hath granted bargain and sold and by these presents does grant bargain sell and convey to the parties of the second part and their successors with general Warranty a piece or parcel of ground lying and being in the village of Occoquan and bounded as follows. Beginning at the South East intersection of Washington and Commerce Streets, running thence with Washington Street twenty five feet. Thence at right angles with said Street forty feet, thence parallel with said Washington street twenty five feet to Commerce street thence with said Commerce street forty feet to the place of beginning. Witness the following signatures and seal.
