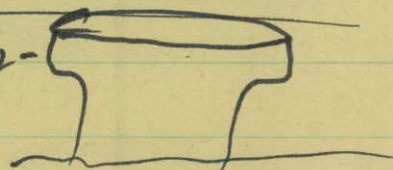
Father was in lumber business + farmed too.
