Faulkland is a two story stone dwelling with a 1½ story wing which was probably original. In 1952 a second balancing wing containing a large room, bath and hall above a garage was added. There is only one outbuilding now used as the caretakers house on the south side of the building.

All of the interior workwork appears to be original. Both original sections have full basements. A date stone is located in the gable of the north end of the original building.

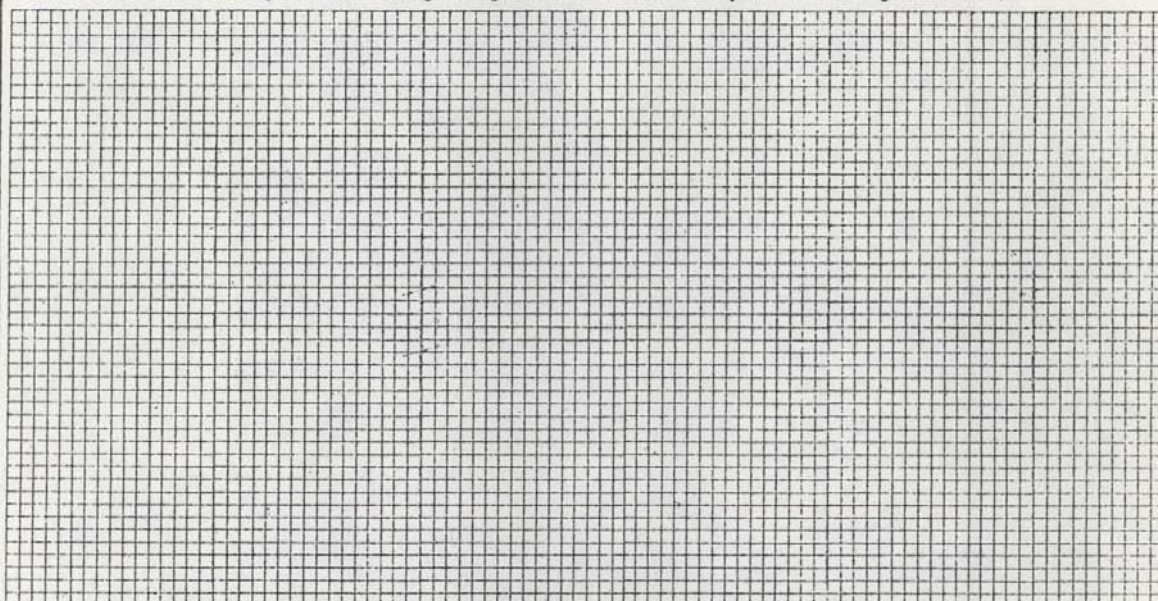

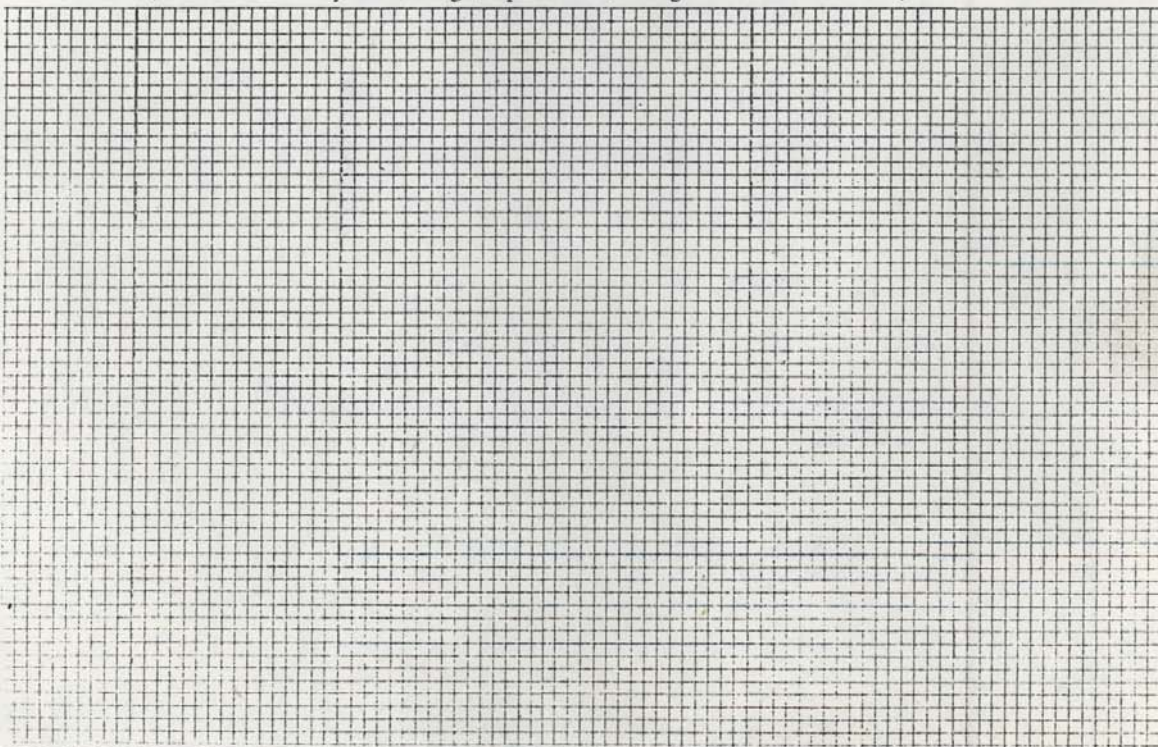
