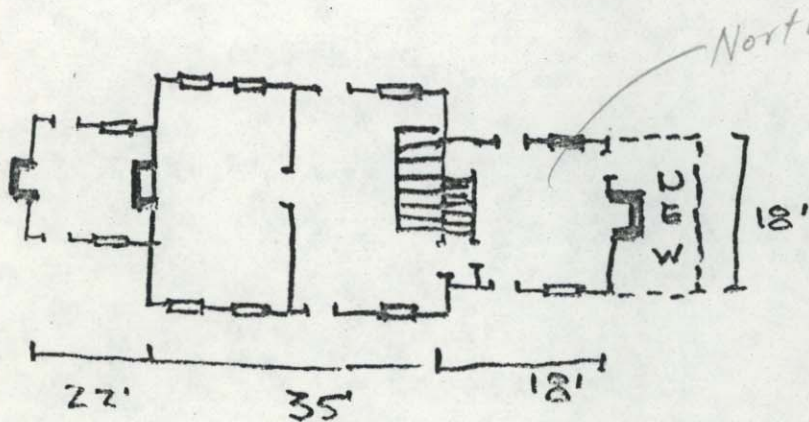

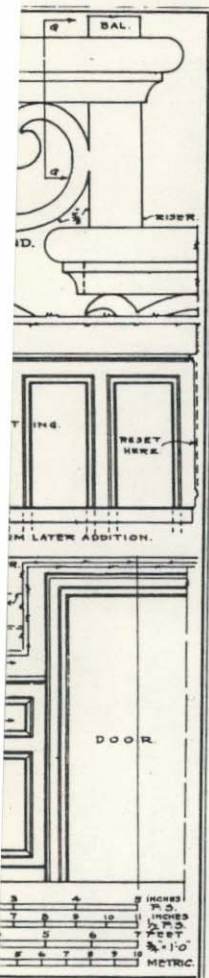


LOCATION County Route #611, 1 mile North of Aden on left

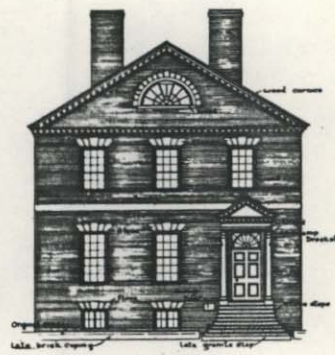

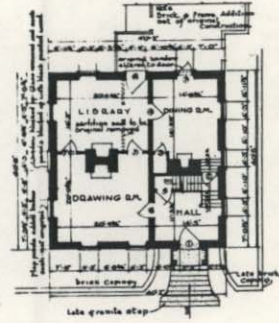
