Grocery store is located, in part, in the two-story frame structure having its gable end to the road. Windows, 1st floor, changed, and windows 2d floor, boarded up. Permastone applied to exterior c1960. Two-story, gable-roofed addition made c1960.

Hardware store located in 1-story gable roofed frame building built as an automobile repair garage sometime in the 1920s.

Interior inspected? Yes.

Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.)

This is actually a collection of three or more buildings joined together in a complex of stores, essentially a grocery and a hardware store, with gardening supplies and variety items also being sold here. The two-story cl900s building where the grocery store is now located was moved from the corner of Washington and Jefferson Sts. where it had previously been operated as a general store, owned by (Albert?) Rust and (Charles J.?) Gillis. James and George Gossom opened the grocery store in this building at its present location in about 1936. They eventually expanded into a one-story building to the east that had been erected on the site of the moved building and operated as an automobile repair garage by Charles Gillis.

The Haymarket Post Office was located in the building now occupied by Gossom's Grocery in about 1900, before this building was moved a few hundred feet west to its present location. Post Office is now located next door, where Hunt's Drug Store was.

The stone tablet in the gable of the grocery store bears the dates 1884-1960 and the inscription "Gossoms." The date 1884 refers to the first store established by Wil (W. T.) Gossom on Mountain Road, north of Waterfall. See survey sheet on this building, which existed in 1978 in deteriorated condition. Other Gossom stores include W. R. Gossom's Store at Hickory Grove. W. R. was James and George's father and it was from him that they learned the business. The date on the tablet 1960 refers to the year in which the permastone siding was applied to the buildings.

According to one source, Rector's Store once existed where the Gossom Store is now.
