I surveyed on May the 20th 1908 for Mr. S. B. Stonnell, his home tract of land lying in the County of Prince William and State of Virginia, and in the vicinity of Occoquan, bounded and described as follows. To wit Beginning at 'A' which is a post driven on the north side of a road corner to John Taylor's land also a corner to McKey's. Hence with the latter S. 15° 15' W. 3119 chains to 'B', a post in a valley north of a branch and north west of a Spring known to McKey and McKey. Thence with McKey S. 52° 38' W. 2532 chains to 'C', a post driven on the eastern side of the Caledonian Road and 21 feet from center of same road a corner to McKey. Thence with McKey for a distance of 21 feet to middle of said road - then with Egypt N. 12° 0' W. 2565 chains from said post Egypt to 'D', a post in a valley. Thence on with Egypt N. 39° 45' W. 3087 chains to 'E', a planted stone in an old stump hole on the southern side of a road corner to E. L. Cookrell and Clark - both tracts being known as Egypt. Thence with Clark's line N. 40° 15' W. 44.18 chains to 'F', a cedar post in Clark's line corner to the Simms tract. Thence with the latter or Roan N. 52° 17' E. 737 chains to 'G', a post on a hill. Thence on with same N. 45° 17' E. 750 chains to 'H', a post. Thence on with same N. 35° 52' E. 956 chains to 'I', a black gum on the northern edge of a road corner to Roan and also corner to Fisher. Thence with the former S. 77° 8' E. 1078 chains to 'J', several planted stones the south east corner of the Roan lot purchased of said Stonnell. Thence with eastern line of said Roan Lot N. 12° 31' E. 1201 chains to 'K', several stones west of a branch corner to said lot and on Stonnell's line. Thence with Foster's line S. 77° 36' E. 846 chains to 'L', a planted stone on the northern edge of a road corner to Foster. Thence with Foster's line S. 60° 48' E. 1573 chains to 'M', a cedar post in Foster's line - and I suppose a corner to Foster. Thence with John Taylor's line S. 88° 44' W. 374 chains to 'N', a fence post corner to said line with same - that is Taylor's S. 25° 48' E. 9836 chains to 'O', a post out of a gully. Thence on with same S. 26° 40' E. 1790 chains to 'P', a planted stone on the northern edge of a branch road corner to said Taylor. Thence along the said road N. 1° 17' E. 18' to 360 chains to 'Q', a post N. 89° 45' E. 850 chains. 3rd N. 79° 45' E. 308 chains to the point of beginning. Containing in all an area of 372,097 acres. - Three hundred seventy two, and ninety seven thousandths acres of ground. Given under my hand this 17th day of May 1908.
