

ENNIS HOUSE: "HOMESTEAD"
TRIANGLE, VA.

Question by Margaret Pishock was:

"Has the Ennis house--"The Homstead"--been researched and included in the survey of historic sites and structures in Prince William County?"

Ennis is written up in Prince William, Its People and Places. This family came early to Prince William, settled in today's Triangle area below Dumfries. The house is said to have been built before 1829.

Ms. Pishock expresses the concern that with the Graham house gone, this is the one remaining historic property remaining in this neighborhood.

It is currently for sale along with its 17 acres for some \$190,000 from Routh Robbins. \$30,000 might obtain the house and an acre or so, but they are trying to sell it all as one package. It is advertised as built before 1829, and is in the vicinity of 18905 Fuller Heights Road, Triangle (next to Kerril Road and opposite the Mayco Gun Shop., and is vicinity of St. Francis Church.

Margaret states that it is reached by a little used road and that the house is hidden from view of the road; that this probably accounts for the vandalism that has occurred there.

Margaret is concerned that either the bulldozer or fire will get it.
