This three-bay, frame, I-type house has an asphalt shingle-covered gable roof pierced by two brick interior stove flue chimneys, one at either end. The exterior is clad with weatherboard siding. The 6.6 sliding sash windows are shuttered (in part) and are surrounded by plain box trim painted dark green. There is a one-story, shed-roofed addition containing a kitchen on the rear, or northeast side. Attached to the one-story rear addition is another small onestory shed or enclosed porch. On the south end is a one-story, hip-roofed enclosed porch.

This house is located on Commerce St., one of the main thorofares in downtown Occoquan. It sits beside another old house which has been converted to a store. Across Commerce St. from this house are several more old houses, three of which could date to the early 1800's when the town of Occoquan was incorporated. A local landmark nearby is the Beechwood Apartment Building, built in the early 1800's as Hammill Hotel. Across Commerce Street from the Harris House is an empty lot, the site of a recently demolished house.




This house has been owned by the Harris family for quite a few years. The present owner inherited the property in 1974.
