Haymarket Police Chief Amos Damron will resign his post Monday night to move to Tuscon, Ariz., where his wife will join a family business, he said today.

"I regret going, but it's one of those things," Damron said. "I gave it considerable thought. It will be like starting over."

The Haymarket Town Council hired Damron, a 38-year-old former Manassas Park police officer, in February, filling a five-month vacancy left by former chief Donn Fasick Jr.

Damron has recommended several replacements to the council, he said. The council is expected to deliberate and decide on a new chief Monday, said Town Clerk Dorothy Keller.

"We haven't actually hired anyone yet," Mrs. Keller said.

Damron declined to identify potential recruits, he said.

His resignation is effective July 22. He will move his wife Tina, 22, and his son Christopher, 2, from the family's Front Royal home to Tuscon.

Once there, she will sign on with her family's beauty shop business, Damron said.

"To be the chief of a small town is the most rewarding experience of my life. They're good people here. Haymarket has the nicest people," Damron said.

Damron began his police career in 1980 with the Arlington Sheriff's Department and worked with the Manassas Park Police Department in 1982, he said.
