Interior, first floor, is a large room with 6 wooden benches at the front facing a raised platform at the rear. A low oak rail divides the two sections. Second floor contains a large room reached by a staircase at right, front, where meetings and other gatherings are held.</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">Exterior walls have had holes drilled in them which were later filled in--insulation?</p>	
Interior inspected? <i>Yes.</i>	
Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.) <p style="margin-left: 40px;">According to the minutes of the Haymarket Town Council of 26 Oct 1883, it was reported that \$561 had been raised to build a combination school house and town hall, \$411 by subscriptions and \$150 from an oyster supper. Council elected a board of trustees and instructed it to make the necessary arrangements.</p>

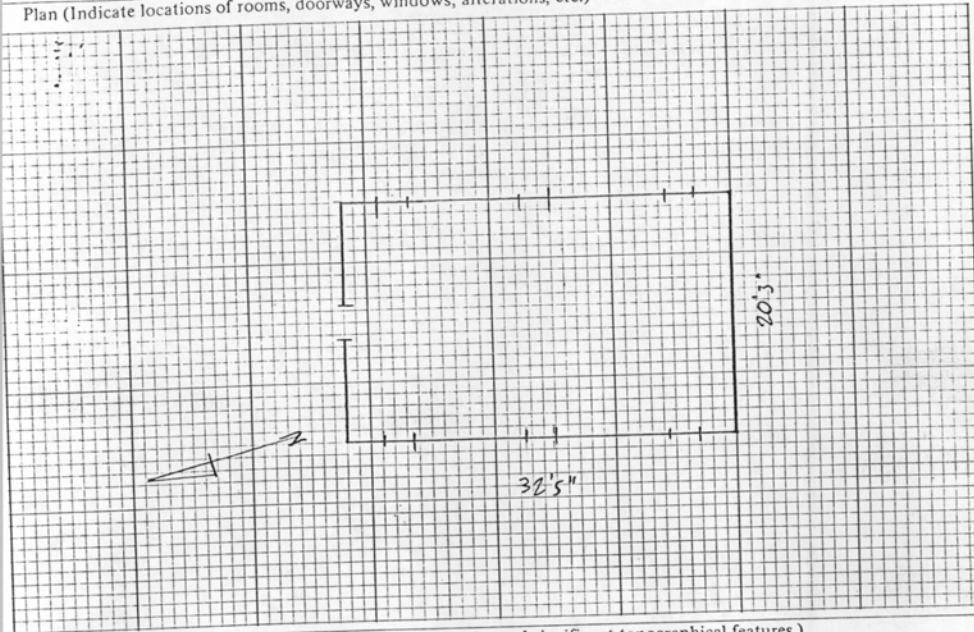

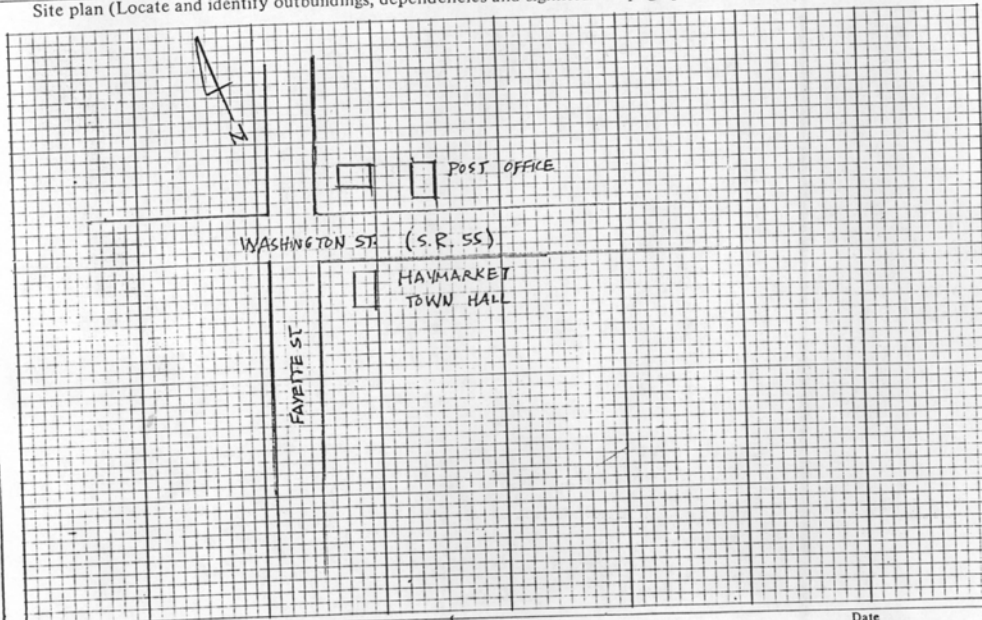
