The original Henry house was of 1 g and later plaster and frame added, It is said the house contained our rooms and was a typical smallfarm house of the period. The story of Hrs Honry's death and the shelling of the house during the first battle of Manassas and it's burning during the second battle seems to be too well known for it to be ret old here.

Hrs Isage Henry was a Carter and brought up in the neighborhood, at Pittsylvania in fact, and Dr Henry's body is in the old cemetary there now.

During the stress of battle, Ers Henry's had to be buried close by and she
rests with in a few feet of her home, together with a son and daughter. There were two Henry sons, both teachers, but one of them was a great traveler, taught a while then became restless and took a trip on foot, ofto to Philadelphia where he had relatives, it was was on one of these trips tha he ovidently lost his life, as nothing was ever heard from him after leaving a farm house on the way, some where in Pasas the streams were high at the a time it is supposed that he lost his footing from a footlog and was drowned

After the war the present house was built on the old site and the remaining son and daughter of Ers Honry lived ther until their death. Every inch of ground here is hallowed by gallant courage and sacrifice , to the east , between the Robinson house and the Hery house was Jackson's line and the spot where he carned sobriquet of Stonovall, very close to the house is the spot there Wade dampton was wounded, but all these spots are indicate by markers, and I suppose it is not necessary to add it to re-

ports. The following houses are all closely connected with the first battle of Hansses, Chinn House Hazel Plain) Stone House , Mathews , Van Pelt, Robinsons, Psotici , (Lowis ) Henry House, Conrade. there are others near Sudloy and Centreville and that figured in the ski raishing the day before and they will be treated of laterealse these that were connected with the second battle.

There have been many distinguished visitors at the Henry house, among them

the grandson of Stonwall Jackson, Major T.J.J. Ohristtian, in 1933. Cattan Coolidge was there, with Mrs Coolidge in '20 and some tried to remove his autograph from the guest book, and while he was foiled in the attemped he defaced a great nu bor of pages.

Mr Fowell who has been the caretaker here for a number of years, is the sen of Wm Powell, who was with Con. Mosby when he raided the old Rectory at Fairfax and tokk Gen. Stoughton prisoner.
