Chimney is made of fieldstone and brick. Patched with Portland cement. Hearth faces northwest. Hearth has a brick jack arch reinforced with a metal brace.

Chimney measures 3' x 5' and rises 12-15' to the shoulders.

Site is surrounded by a pile of stone rubble roughly measuring 15' x 20'.

Chimney is on the same property with the Spencer House, q.v.

Interior inspected? N/A

Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.)

According to the owner, Mrs. Bertha V. Spencer, whose family has resided in this part of the county for a long time, the chimney is all that remains of a log house that was burned about 20 years ago.

Informants say that this house was located near a demolished mill run by the Taylors, later the Gibsons, who lived in the house now belonging to the Spencers.

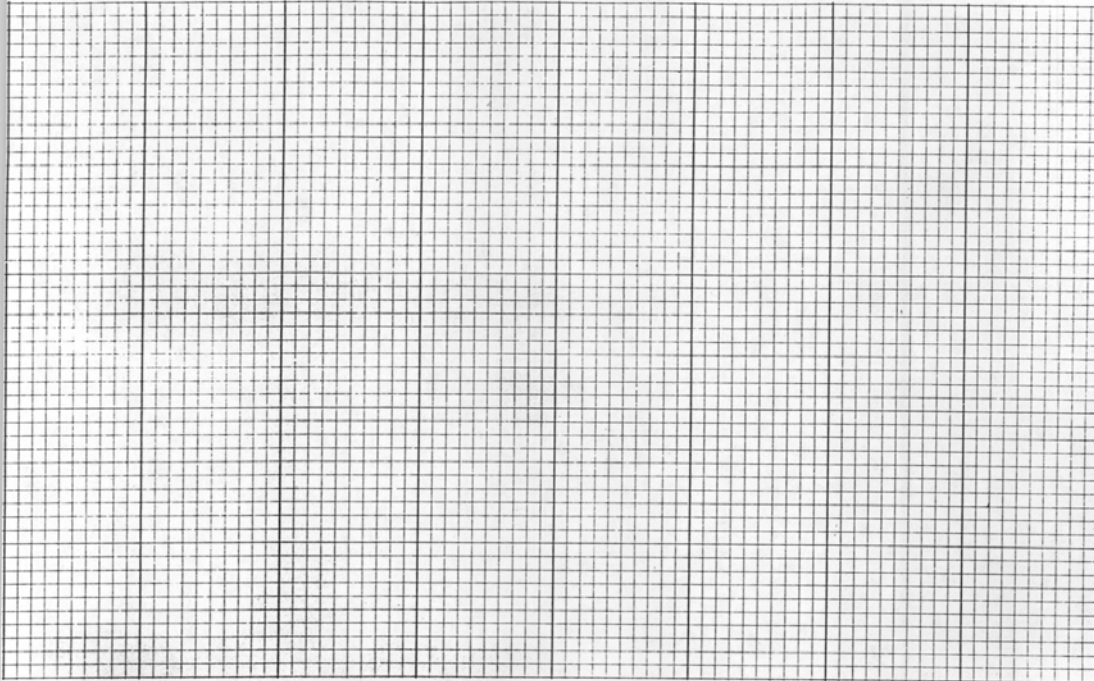

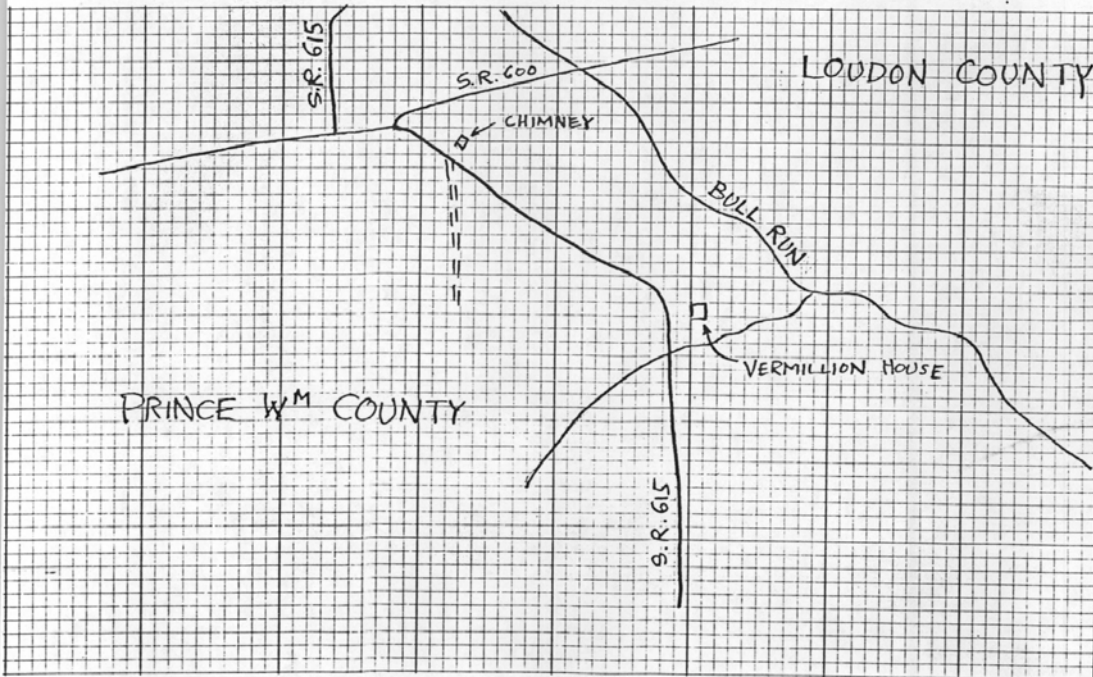
