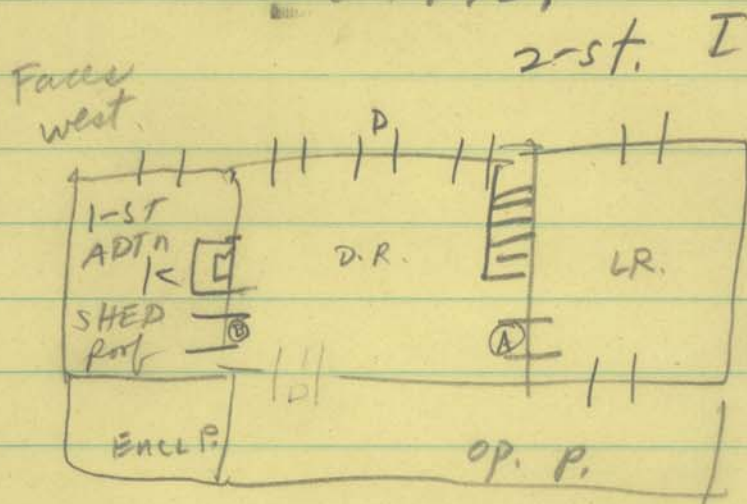

(A) old 6-panel moulded door w/ been a plain shelf
box lock - moulded on side plain w/a narrow
raised panels on the other surround.

old pine floors, med-to wide
floors in attic are wide widths
nailed w/ square-headed cut
nails

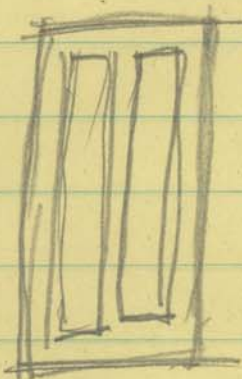


House is put top, w mortar + ferris joints + lg. pegs.
has a weatherboard exterior.

no basement, just a crawl space
roof is m + T. + pegged.

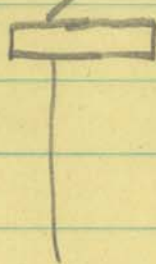

Some of the doors are late 19th C. 4-panel doors; others, namely (B) are doors on 2d fl. are vertically paneled doors. moulded panels.



Stone chimney almost 3 feet deep has 1 weathering w/ shelf of stone projecting out at shoulder

only 1 f.p. (on 1st fl.)



very square stack




stones are red sandstone laid in rough courses. mid-19th century style. Capped w/ a brick chimney shelf.
