A most delightful visit with Calder and we got quite a bit of coverage on numerous places, which he'll no doubt go over with you when he returns on Monday.

Photographed Upperville, Ebenezer Baptist Church, got by the Lake House (Swifts) in Rectorstown; checked the Waterford Dig- to which Calder had the same reaction I have had; but it's the Foundations project and I am only checking in on it not having it done- looked over the Log Building of the Loudoun County Museum, a Victorian Store front in Leesburg that needs Preserving and protection, got by the Agricultural Institute, Windfields and then looked over Millwood and photographed Rectorstown.

Will get out the Windfields report shortly, now that the "expert" has had a chance to view the structures and what's happening to them!!

Let me know if you have contacted the Power Company per their either moving or burying the Power Poles at the Millwood (Burwell-Morgan) mill site. Or perhaps you could send a letter to me about this and your feelings about it, and I could send it on to the Garden Club and Mrs. Byrd, and let those two get after them..

Took in the "Belle Grove" Dedication, and have an appointment in early September to go over the Frederick County Historical Society's collection of photographs, which the curator there is now cataloging. Will also catch up with Mr. Garland Quarrels of Winchester at that time, and hopefully also take in Cines Mill, which is near Winchester and I understand is virtually all in original condition.

Hope we'll get down to Richmond in the not too distant future to go over files on this area, and possibly pick up the Assurance Policies at that time.
