Site of mansion built mid-18th century by Henry Lee II. See Templeman, Arlington Heritage, p. 40.

The site is on a ridge with commanding view of the Potomac. The ridge has been cut through by a east-west private road. Random probing in 1973 did not locate brickwork. Rough stonework is visible in the north bank of the road cut, said to be remains of a dependency.
