with respect to Elizabeth Bullitt

Hill on the south shore of second run of Bullitt Co. on
 306 acre sold to vestry by Thomas Harrison 3/27/1749.

Look up Thomas Harrison who sold 400
 acre on Quantico Creek to Rev. James Scott,
 for his glebe for Dettingen Parish, which was
 formed soon after 1745. The vestry book (in
 P. W. County Clerks office) commenced in 1745 and
 continued ~~until~~ to 1785. Dettingen Parish was
 cut out of Hamilton Parish, which, in 1745, covered
 all of what is now P. W. Co. and Fauquier -
 Dettingen was named of Dettingen in Germany near
 which the English gained a victory in 1743. ^{James} Scott
 was minister of Dumfries from 1745 to 1882
 when he died. Scott ~~in~~ lived most the time at
 Westwood, the gift of his brother (probably his elder
 brother Alexander Scott, minister of Overwharton Parish
 in Stafford). ~~Mr. James Scott served~~ Were two
 church in Dettingen Parish, one near Dumfries and
 one near ^{two} streams Broad Run and Glator Run, and
 some times called by either name. Scott served both
 churches equally. First church in Dumfries,
 an old and indifferent one was sold in 1752 for
 fifteen hundred weight of tobacco. A new one,
 costing 100,000 weight was ordered. Contractor was
 Mr. Waite, The church at Broad Run was also
 contracted for in 1752. Both were of brick.
 (Probably designed by Arch. Ayness.) Roof & walls

of church at Broad Run fell in not many years
later (but likely ^{in early 1800, after soon after} after 1782, ~~year of~~ Scott's death)

Church at Dumfries was in ruin before 1857.

The town of Dumfries by 1857 was near as much
in ruins as the church. Church at Broad Run had

a galleries install by Thomas Harrison. The other
galleries were installed by the vestry and sold. Stoves

were not known in the land by 1857, Sextons
built fires (but probably in the vestry-room in the

yard. (Note - at Pulick - the little building
back of church is probably a vestry-room)

(Tippling Houses - taverns)

James Scott was succeed by his son John, who
resigned ^{the following} ~~within~~ a year. ^{and died soon after.} ~~He had challenged~~

At 18 he had challenge a certain dangerous man to
duel. He applied to his Brother in law Mr. Bullett to be

his second. Bullett tried to dissuad him in a letter
but failed. He attended him to the place of combat, -

end of the Old Quaker Church. Bullett tried to
prevent the duel and quarreled with the other combatants

which resulted in him ~~leaving~~ in slaying him.

^{Bullett was acquitted on self defence.}
Scott fled the Country and with his brother Gustave
went to Scotland
