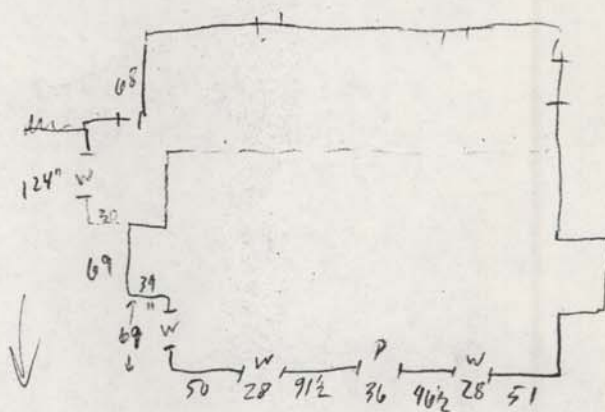
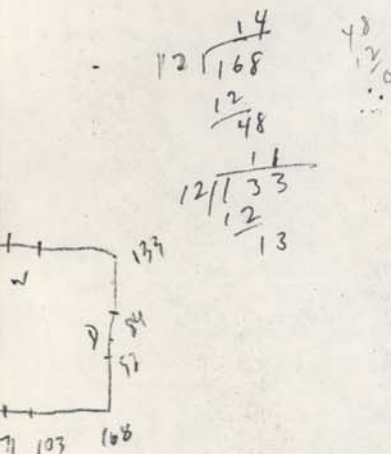

Cabin may have been covered over with channeled siding as in upper half of west gable end. Cabin has been lately patched with cement but was earlier chinked with stones and mud, as is the Cockrill log house on Carolina Road, and other log houses on Mountain Road, namely the Leonard-Smith House and the Lansdowne-Hatcher House.

There was apparently a window or door in the upper half of the west gable end. Logs are V-notched. Ends of logs once covered with double cornerboards.

Interior inspected? No

Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.)

The log cabin was supposedly built by Mr. Sinclair, a local craftsman who was living in the cabin and using it as a shoemaking shop in about the 1880's.

This building has most recently been used as a chicken coop, and lately as a storage shed.

Cabins of this size and construction are virtually non-existent in this part of the county where they once were numerous, and this one should definitely be preserved.
