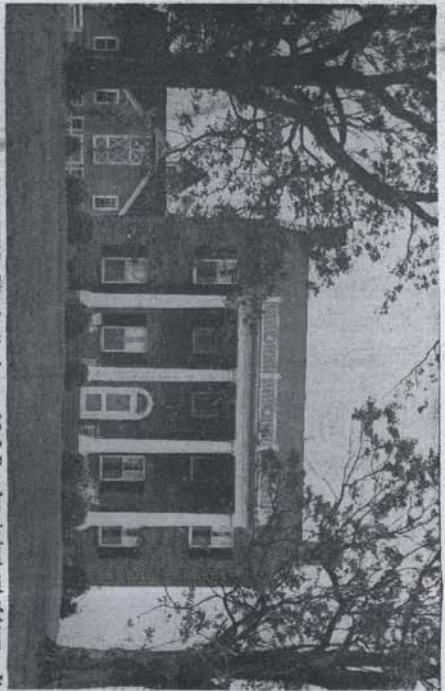


# Commuters Invasion Erases Civil War Sentiments of Manassas
