roof is asphalt shingle roof. May have been slate.

Historic Occoquan has some material on it.

Waterproofed the basement
painted it.
patched roof

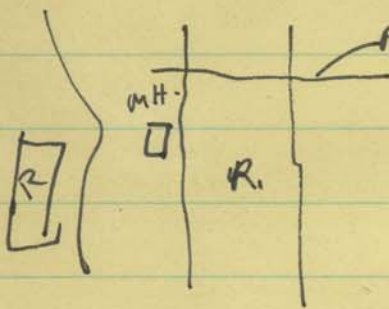
partial basement, only,

It may have been attached to another bldg.

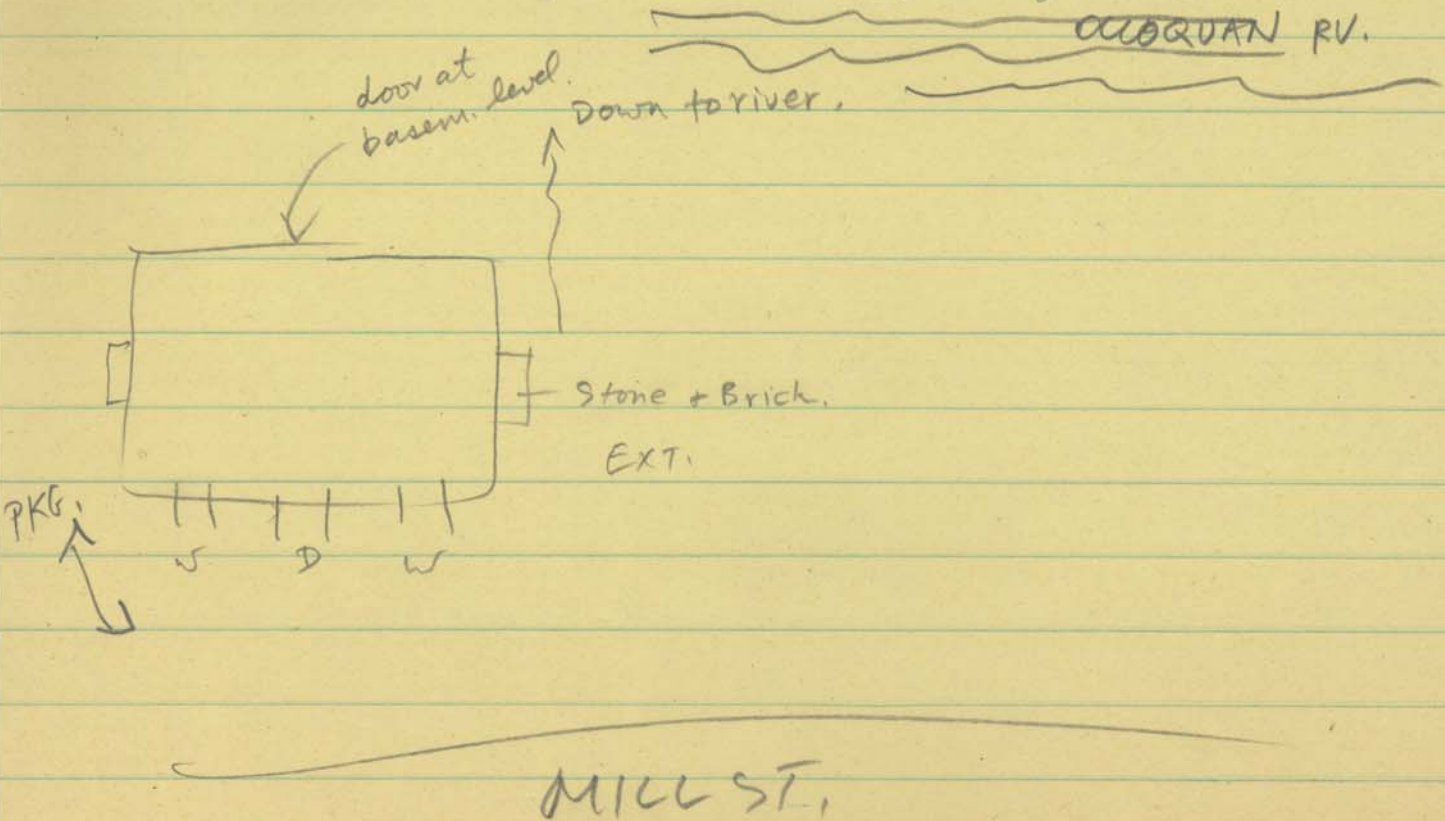
Mill house

Bldg. had been part of properties of the
Alexandria Water Co., which the Authority
acq in 1967.

2-year lease. \$1.00 a year.

Mill house, built in 1793, served the adjacent
Merchant's Mill, which operated from 1759 - 1924,
when it burned. Automatic mill 1-man oper.

av. 150 barrels wheat ground daily.
