

mill was closed in 1930s and dismantled

The Milford Mill (early/mid-19th
century) was the location of an
early Post Office + Store in Manassas vic. from ^{1839 to} 1852,
operated by William J. Weir.

This Was Prince William on the P.O.]

P.O. was on RR + was called Bristoe Station, 1839-1852.

near present Manassas,

Wm. J. Weir had a store + P.O., called Liberia, ^
then moved it to the site on
Broad Run. His house was also
called Liberia.

Mill owner in mid-19th c. was John R. Hornbaker
who rebuilt the mill. Later it was owned by Walter
Aylor + C.J. Hoetze. ^[MEET SE] A merchant flour mill.

Ewell mill was at the same
approximate location in 1820.
